Informal Objection

Dear Applicant:

The staff has under consideration: (1) the above-captioned minor change application (application) for W293CC, Remsen, New York, and; (2) the Informal Objection (Objection) filed by Gail Jay (Jay) on October 23, 2014. For the reasons set forth below, we deny the Objection and grant the application.

Northeast Gospel Broadcasting, Inc. filed the application to change channel from 293 to 291, making the translator co-channel to WGLU-LP, Newport, NY. Jay claims, in the Objection, that the proposed translator will cause interference and reduce the ability of WGLU-LP to reach local listeners in the Barneveld, New York area. Section 74.1204(a) states that an application for an FM translator station will not be accepted for filing if the proposed operation would involve overlap of predicted field strength contours with any other authorized facility.

Our review of the application, per Section 74.1204, shows that there is no predicted overlap between the proposed interfering contour (40 dB μ) of the translator and the protected contour (60 dB μ) of WGLU-LP. Furthermore, Jay fails to demonstrate that grant of this application would violate any Commission rule or policy. The applicant satisfies all applicable spacing and interference requirements. Therefore, we will deny the Objection.

Accordingly, the October 23, 2014 Informal Objection filed by Gail Jay IS HEREBY DENIED and the application BMPFT-20140929ARO IS HEREBY GRANTED. This action is taken pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 0.283.
