NOW, THEREFORE, Seller, for and in consideration of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and other good and valuable consideration in hand paid to Seller by Buyer, does hereby grant, sell, assign, transfer, convey and deliver to Buyer all of Seller's rights, duties, benefits and obligations under the APA and transfers them on an AS IS, WHERE IS, AND WITH ALL FAULTS, and without any warranties, express or implied.




