Dear Dr. Bundy:

This is response to your letter of May 27, 1996 concerning the above-referenced noncommercial, educational FM stations. These stations were previously granted waivers of 47 C.F.R. §§ 73.1860 (a) and (b) so to permit unattended operation subject to specified conditions. In light of changes in the Commission's rules regarding unattended operation, you have requested that these waivers be removed.

We agree that the waivers are no longer necessary. The Report and Order in MM Docket 94-130, 10 FCC Rcd 11479 (1995), affords licensees of broadcasting stations the option of operating their stations unattended pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 73.1300.

Accordingly, the conditions placed on the respective authorization instruments for KTPH(FM), KCIE(FM), KZMU(FM), KLNR(FM), KGHR(FM) and KGLP(FM) ARE REMOVED. A copy of this letter will be placed in the file of each of these stations.
