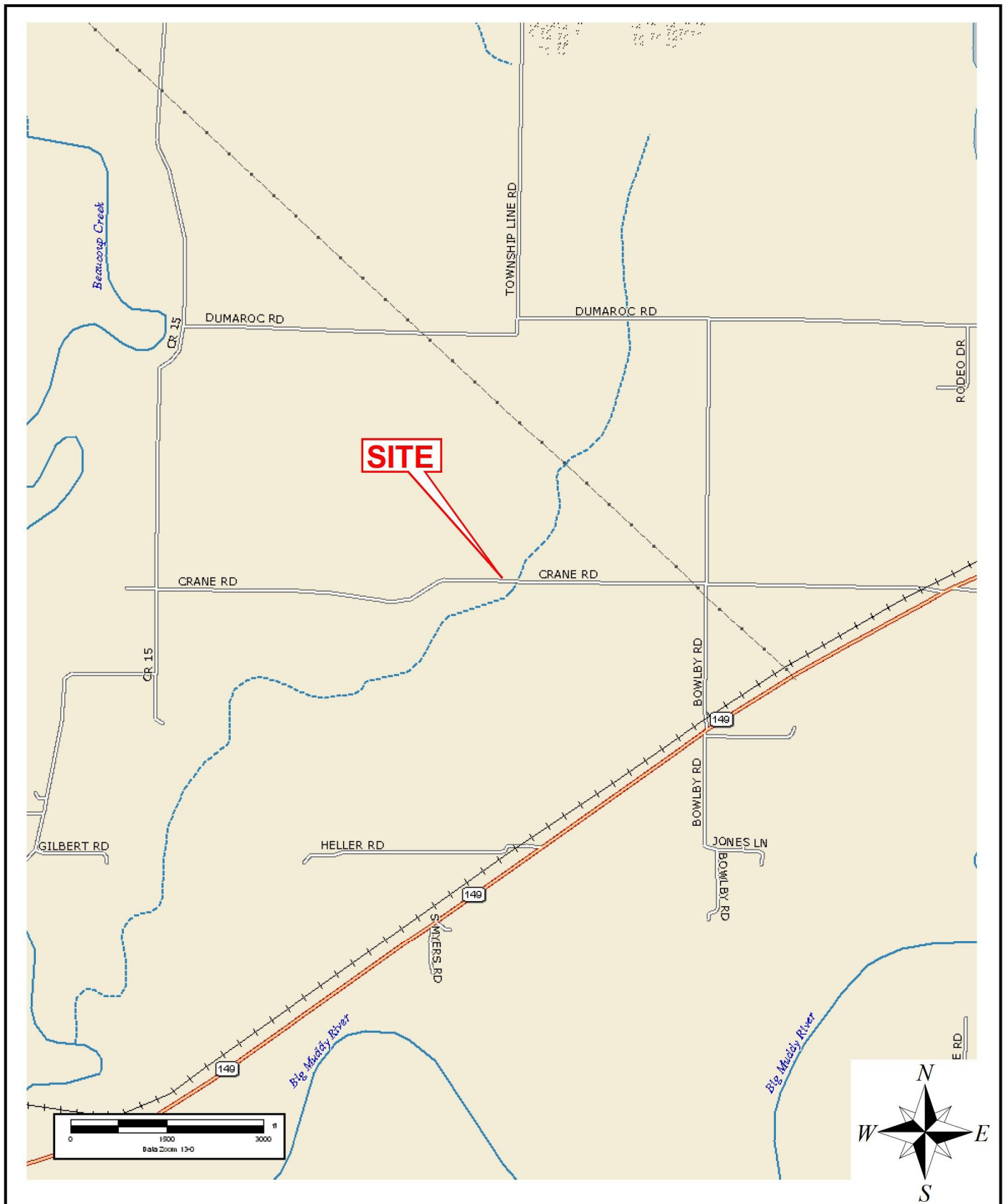

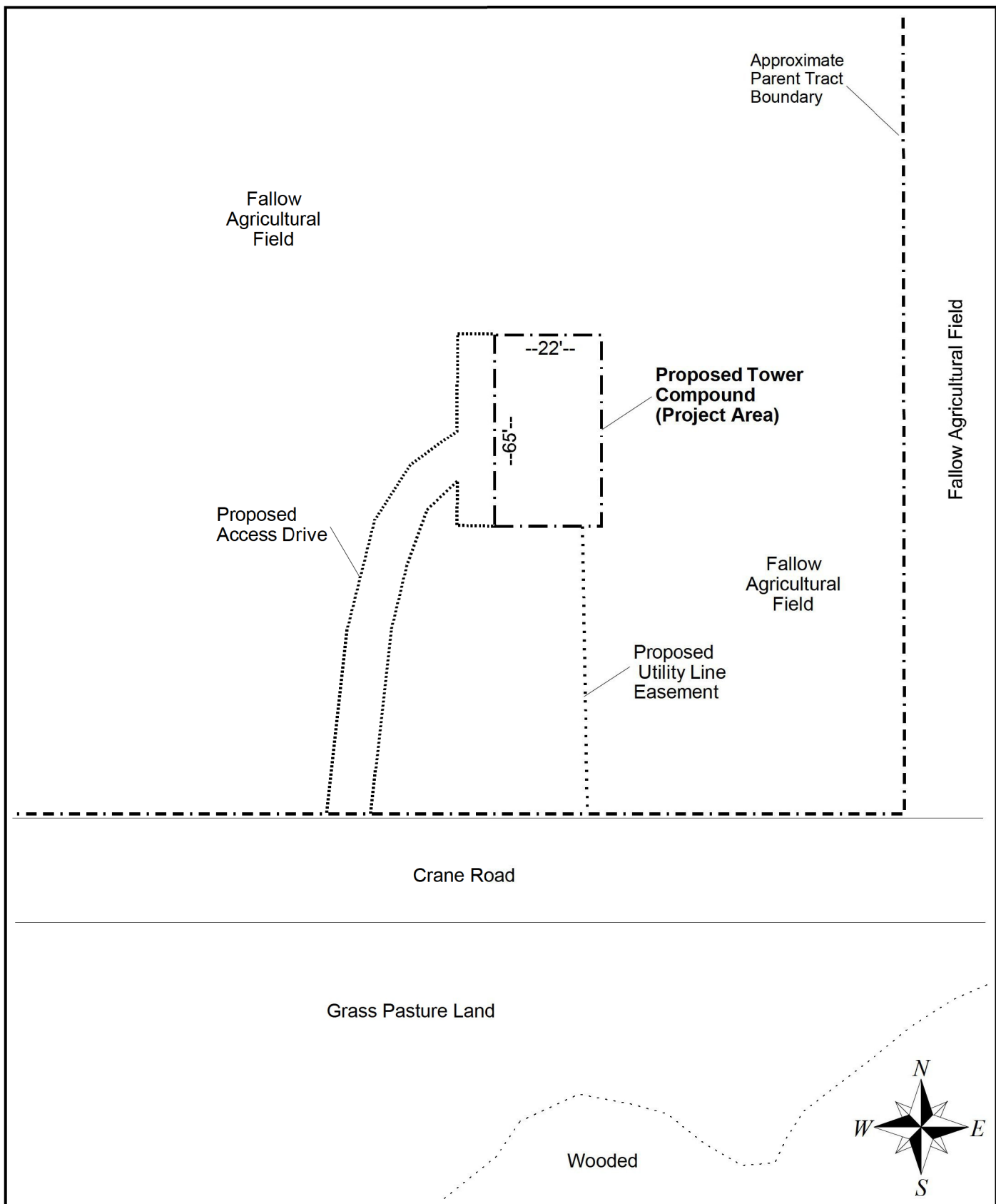

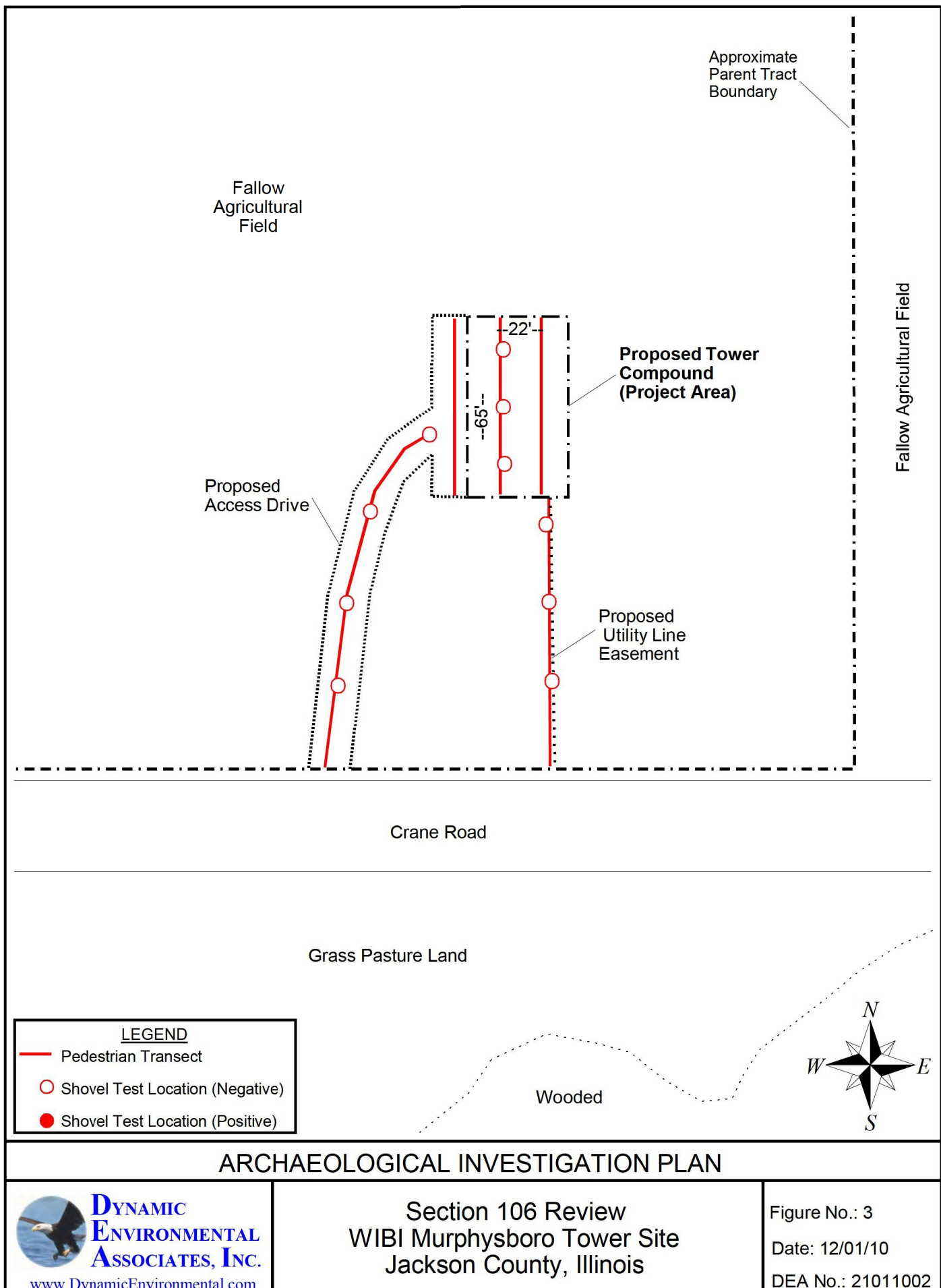

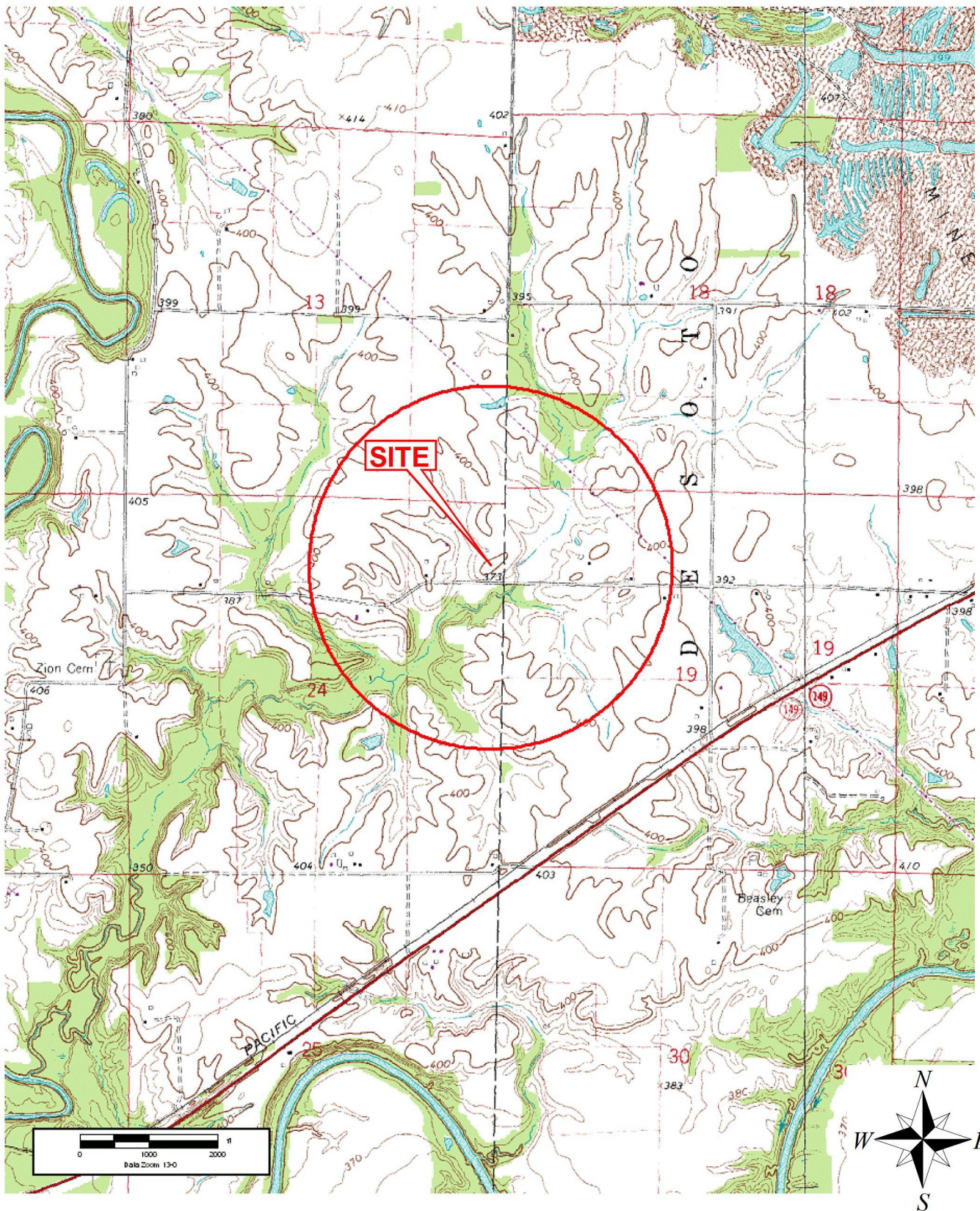

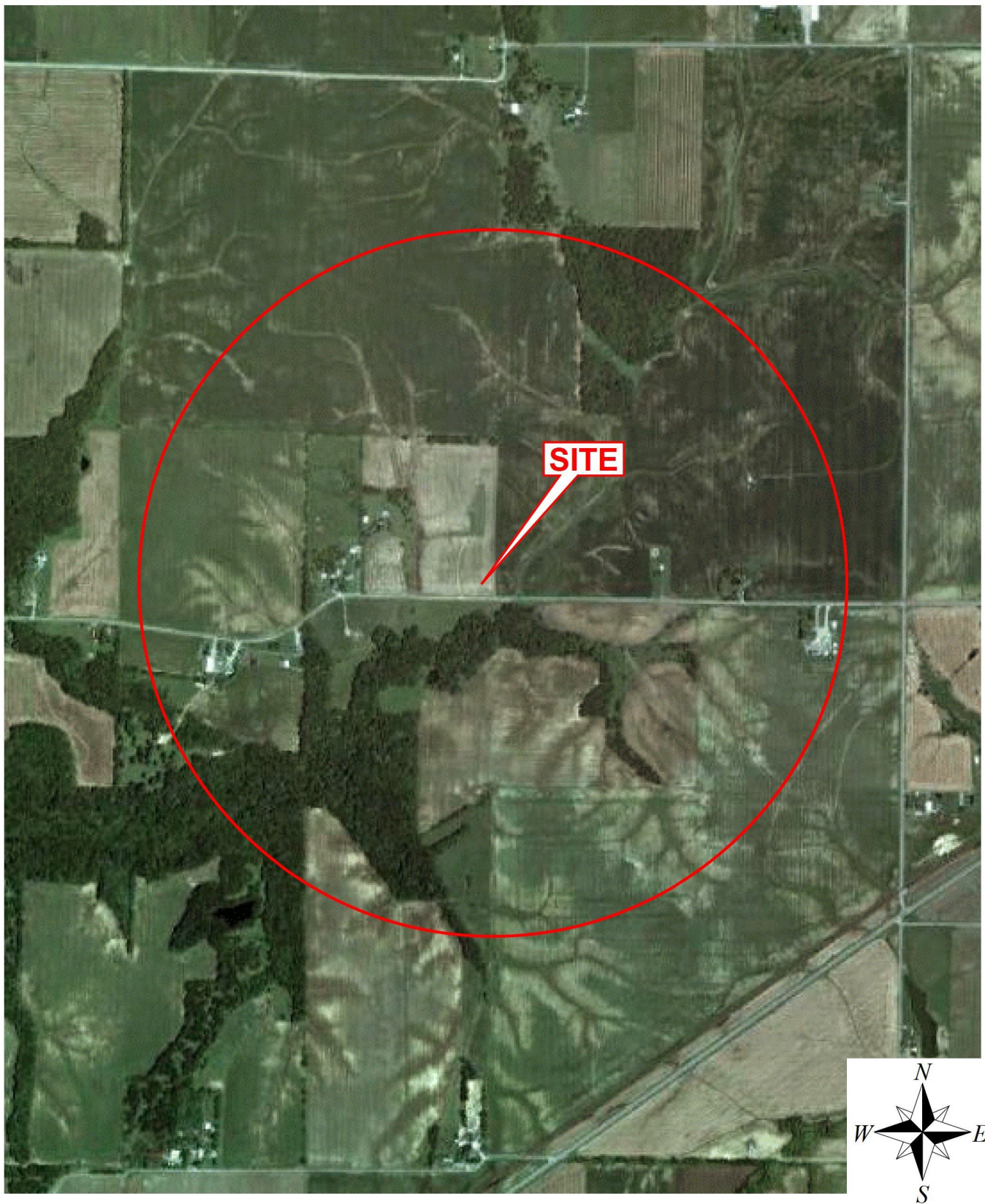

The Miami Tribe of Oklahoma is satisfied with efforts conducted to be sure that no Miami historic properties or other Miami cultural resources will likely be adversely affected by construction and use of this tower. The Miami Tribe of Oklahoma is not currently aware of any specific Miami cultural or historic site in this project area. We therefore offer no objection to the proposed construction.

Because this tower lies in the homelands of the Miami, in the event that archaeological materials, including human remains, are discovered during construction or later ground-disturbing activities at this location, please re-open consultation at that time by contacting our THPO at gstrack@miamination.com or 317-625-1288. Similarly, if plans are considered to expand or modify this tower and cause additional ground disturbance in the future, please let us know. Please forward the Tribe's concerns regarding any such future work and unanticipated discoveries, as well as our contact information, to the appropriate parties.

We urge everyone involved with cell tower development to construct and maintain their projects in keeping with best practices for minimizing environmental impact – particularly on species, such as bird and bats, who might incur negative impacts from cell tower development and use. Please also re-vegetate with species native to the area.

Abstract

Following standards set forth in the Nationwide Programmatic Agreement of March 2005, DEA investigated the potential impacts of a proposed broadcast tower facility to be constructed by New Life Media in the Village of DeSoto, Somerset Township, Jackson County, Illinois. The proposed Site will consist of a 65' x 22' (6.7 x 19.8 m) tower compound area. Within the tower compound area will be a 125' (38.1 m) tall self-support tower and associated equipment. The approximately 15' (4.6 m) wide proposed access easement will extend approximately 165' (50.3 m) north, and then east, from Crane Road to end at the tower compound area. The approximately 5' wide (1.5 m) proposed utility easement will extend south from the tower compound area approximately 120' (36.6 m) to Crane Road. Background research indicated that no previously documented historic properties are located within one-half mile of the proposed undertaking. Archaeological investigations performed within the APE for direct effects did not encounter evidence of an archaeological site. No cultural resources have yet to be identified by contacted governmental entities or members of the general public. It is recommended that no significant historic resources will be impacted by the proposed undertaking.

1. Introduction

New Life Media has proposed to construct a broadcast tower facility on the north side of Crane Road in the Village of DeSoto, Somerset Township, Jackson County, Illinois (Figure 1). The proposed Site will consist of a 65' x 22' (6.7 x 19.8 m) tower compound area. Within the tower compound area will be a 125' (38.1 m) tall self-support tower and associated equipment. Proposed associated equipment includes a 15' x 12' (4.6 x 3.7 m) transmitter building, a propane tank and emergency generator, and an air conditioning unit. The approximately 15' (4.6 m) wide proposed access easement will extend approximately 165' (50.3 m) north and then east from Crane Road to end at the tower compound area. The approximately 5' wide (1.5 m) proposed utility easement will extend south from the tower compound area approximately 120' (36.6 m) to Crane Road (Figure 3 and Appendix II Photographs).

2. Methods

Following the methods and standards set forth by the Nationwide Programmatic Agreement of March 2005, site evaluation included requested input from Native American Tribes, as well as, local, regional, state entities as to the potential impacts to historic resources posed by the proposed tower construction. Native American Tribes were notified of the proposed telecommunication tower construction through the Tower Construction Notification System (TCNS) located on the FCC website (www.fcc.gov).

Letters, requesting comments, were sent by certified mail on November 17, 2010, to the offices of the Village of DeSoto, Somerset Township, Jackson County, and the Jackson County Historical Society. Comments from the general public concerning the proposed project were also solicited in the form of a public notice ad published in a newspaper of record circulated in the project vicinity. This public notice ad was published in *The Southern Illinosan* on November 24 and December 1, 2010. As of the date of this submission no comments have been received from the Village of DeSoto, Somerset Township, Jackson County, the Jackson County Historical Society, or members of the general public.

An APE for both visual and direct effects were identified for the proposed tower facility. The APE for visual, or indirect, effects is the geographic area in which the proposed undertaking has the potential to introduce visual elements that would diminish or alter the setting of any historic property where integrity of setting is a character-defining feature of such property that, in part, makes it eligible for the National Register. Specifically, this geographic area is the area in which the proposed broadcast tower would be visible, and if so, would have the potential to introduce visual elements that would alter or diminish the integrity of any historic property's relationship to surrounding features and open space, therefore compromising the ability of such property to convey its historic significance. In accordance with the Nationwide Programmatic Agreement of March 2005, a one-half mile (.8 km) APE for visual effects is applicable to this 125' (38.1 m) tall broadcast tower (Figures 1 and 4).

According to a review of records held by the Illinois State Museum, and a review of the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency's online Historic Architecture and Archaeological Resources Geographic Information System (HAARGIS) no previously documented historic properties are located within one-half mile of the proposed undertaking. This same review indicated that no previous cultural resource surveys have been conducted within one-half mile of the proposed undertaking. A review of the NRHP online database indicates that no NRHP-listed resources are located within the one-half mile APE assessed for this project.

In addition, the APE for direct effects was determined by an examination of plan maps
