

## EXHIBIT 2

### PROPOSAL TO ADVANCE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMING IN THE COMMUNITY

The applicant proposes to operate in accordance with the definition of "public telecommunications services" set out in Section 397(14) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended. The applicant will utilize the facilities of the station to support the educational programs of the community.

The applicant was incorporated in the State of Indiana.

Programming for the proposed station will be designed to provide listeners with a broad range of educational opportunities, including interactive call-in programs that help the community to learn by sharing their opinions and holding them up to critical scrutiny. Programming will address political, governmental and social values, including a discussion of Biblical principles that apply to such issues. The station will also provide public service publicity for organizations serving the community, local weather information and announcements concerning emergency situations in the broadcast area.

This unique format will be intermixed with appropriate light entertainment and inspirational music. It is proposed that the station will primarily serve the city of license and will also provide programming to other neighborhoods within the service contour.

The proposed programming will include general educational, instructional, news, public affairs, updated weather summaries, religious, light entertainment and inspirational programs.

Specific planned programming relating to issues of public concern include:

1. Jobs acquisition training and placement for low income people. Program – Job Mart. 15 minute program to air each Monday morning at 7 a.m. to alert the community to job availabilities.

2. Collecting and coordinating food and clothing distribution to the needy.

Program – Food Mart. 15 minute program to air each Monday at 8 a.m. to alert the community to food and clothing distribution opportunities.

3. Assistance in locating low income housing.

Program – Housing Mart. 15 minute program to air each Monday at 7:15 a.m. to alert the community to low income housing opportunities.

4. Biblical instruction and training.

Program – The Bible Speaks. 2 hour program to air each weekday at 7 p.m. to include instruction and discussion of Biblical issues by the host and members of the public who call the station.

5. Reporting local schools' activities.

Program – School Today. 15 minute program to air at 7:30 a.m. each weekday to alert the community to current and upcoming school activities.

6. Local, national and world news reporting.

Program – News Today. 15 minute program each weekday at 9 a.m. reporting primarily on local news and including some national and world news of particular importance.

7. Political events reporting.

Program – Today in Politics. 30 minute program to air each Saturday evening at 7 p.m. reporting primarily on local elections and including some regional and national elections of particular importance.
