Request for Special Temporary Authority

Nebraska Educational Telecommunications Commission (“NETC”), licensee of TV Translator Station K10JW, Verdigre, Nebraska, and pursuant to Section 73.1635 of the Commission’s Rules, respectfully requests Special Temporary Authority (“STA”) to operate the station at a variance from its licensed parameters.

NETC recently lost its rights to utilize the site licensed for K10JW’s operation, following the land owner’s request for removal of the transmitting tower. As a result of losing the TV translator’s site, NETC has been forced to temporarily take the station off-air. (The Commission was notified of K10JW’s silent status in FCC File No. BRET-20060201ASV, and CDBS currently reflects its off-air status.) Accordingly, NETC has made plans for an alternate transmission site for K10JW, located within one mile of the licensed site, and has already filed a minor change application with the FCC to relocate the station facility (FCC File No. BPTTV-20060202AIY, accepted February 3, 2006). NETC now applies for STA to operate immediately from the exact same technical parameters specified in the pending minor change application in File No. BPTTV-20060202AIY. NETC therefore respectfully requests STA as proposed in this filing to permit operation in conformance with the pending minor change application (until such time as the permanent modifications are granted by the FCC), or, should the Commission find it to be a better use of its resources, expedited processing of the minor change in File No. BPTTV-20060202AIY for the same technical proposal (in which case the STA would not be necessary).

NETC requires STA in order to restore service to K10JW viewers. Station K10JW rebroadcasts the programming of NETC’s noncommercial educational station KXNE-TV, Norfolk, Nebraska as part of NETC’s state-wide noncommercial television network of eight full-service television stations and 14 TV translators. As a whole, the NETC network blankets the state of Nebraska with its noncommercial educational programming, and K10JW in particular reaches a portion of northeastern Nebraska that otherwise would not receive service from one of its full-service public TV station signals. NETC requests STA so that it may restore service to those viewers following the loss of the translator site and pending formal authorization for the permanent relocation.

The stated mission of NETC is to educate, challenge, and inspire Nebraska, the nation, and the world through excellence in noncommercial telecommunications. Grant of the requested STA (or, should the Commission prefer, expedited processing of the pending minor change application) will serve the public interest because it will permit NETC to minimize the length of the silent status for K10JW and to resume its operations despite the loss of its site.

NETC is a noncommercial educational licensee and operates K10JW on a noncommercial educational basis. Moreover, NETC qualifies as a governmental entity. This request is therefore exempt from FCC filing fee requirements, pursuant to § 1.1114 of the FCC’s Rules, and the facility is exempt from FCC regulatory fees, pursuant to § 1.1162. This request is also exempt from the Anti-Drug Abuse Act certification requirements pursuant to § 1.2002(c).
