POINTS OF EXCELLENCE

- McNeese is the first university in the state to offer a concentration in Forensics Chemistry.
- McNeese offers a concentration in Terrorism, Preparedness and Security that is one of the first of its kind in the nation.
- Dr. Ron Darbeau in the chemistry department has developed a new way of making high quality polymers for industrial use and has been awarded the university's first patent.
- McNeese has been rated as one of the top schools in the nation for the individual attention students receive from MSU faculty in the College Catalog published by Newsweek. Other well-known names on that list are Harvard and Stanford Universities.
- McNeese has six Senior Fulbright Scholars on its faculty that have traveled to Greece, Finland, Moldova, Romania, Rwanda and China.

- Dr. Mark Merchant in the chemistry department is conducting research to isolate antibiotic peptides found in the tissues of the alligator that could have potential medical and biotechnological applications involving a new class of drugs.
- The 2004 Speech and Debate Team won the national championship in its division at the 22nd Annual Novice National Individual Events Tournament. McNeese finished first place overall and this is the second consecutive year that the team won its division at this tournament. In addition, Monroe freshmen Marcus Beckwith and Paul Conway won the novice national title in dramatic duo. Conway also was named Novice National Champion in programmed oral interpretation.
- The MSU College of Nursing is nationally accredited by the National League of Nursing and continually has a high passing rate on the nursing licensing examination.
- The MSU Engineering Program is nationally accredited and 38 percent of the engineers that work in local industries are McNeese graduates.
