Dear Mr. Eckelbarger:

Thank you for contacting me regarding your plans to file a transmitter site change application with the FCC for KNLB and KWFH. We anticipate no interference to KMOH-TV6 and provide this letter as proof of concurrence. We have extended this same concurrence to a previous owner of KNLB and received no interference complaints from viewers.

Therefore, KMOH has no objections to the project proceeding with the understanding that in the case of any interference from your station to the reception of KMOH by its' viewers, your FM station will undertake whatever is necessary, at its own expense, to remedy the situation within 30 days of the problem being made known to you. Depending on the severity of the interference, these remedies may include ceasing operation of your station if a solution cannot be found.

KMOH also requires you to notify us when you commence operation with the new facilities and provide us with the name and telephone number of a contact person to whom any complaints may be directed.

We further require your FM station to buy, at your own expense, four reasonably sized ads in the local Sunday newspaper for a week preceding and the three weeks following the commencement of the operation of the new facilities. These ads will be placed in the Sunday TV section and will advise viewers of the changes to your FM station, how these changes may impact their reception of KMOH and how a viewer may contact your FM station to lodge a complaint.

Finally, while we do not expect any serious problems, KMOH requires that we have the final say on how serious an interference problem our viewers may be expected to "tolerate". We will accommodate your proposed facilities improvement in any way practical, but must always give top priority to the viewers of KMOH.
