Letter states that “W231DC is required to eliminate any actual interference it causes.”³ A cash payout does not equate to the elimination of interference. Because these settlements contravene law, these listener complaints remain unanswered and Sun has not adequately responded to the Bureau Letter.

Beasley therefore renews its request that the W231DC operations be suspended until Sun remedies the interference being caused to the reception of Station WLLD in a manner that complies with law. If the interference cannot be remedied, then Beasley respectfully requests that Sun be forced to suspend the Translator’s operations indefinitely.



The Bureau Letter also summarizes Section 74.1203(b) of the Commission’s rules, which states that “[i]f interference cannot be properly eliminated by the application of *suitable techniques*, operation of the offending FM translator . . . station shall be suspended and shall not be resumed until the interference has been eliminated.” 47 C.F.R. § 74.1203(b) (emphasis added). Again, a cash payout to a listener is not a “suitable technique” to resolve interference.
