Request for Special Temporary Authorization

EXHIBIT A

On behalf of Multimedia Holdings Corporation (“Multimedia”), licensee of TV translator K61FB, Globe-Miami, Arizona (Facility ID #35487), hereby files an application for Special Temporary Authority (STA) to operate on digital displacement Channel 48 pending the grant of its Construction Permit displacement application filed with the FCC on October 22, 2009 (FCC File No. BDISDTT 2009-1022AAQ).

To date, the Construction Permit application remains pending at the FCC. The FCC’s International Bureau referred this application to the Mexican government for clearance because the translator is located within the FCC’s benchmark proximity for LPTV UHF proposals: 275 km from the U.S./Mexican border. While the Mexican government evaluates this proposal, and as the Commission is aware, wireless services such as Verizon Wireless have received authorization to deploy operation in the 700 MHz band. Verizon Wireless has informed Multimedia that it intends to commence testing, and possibly deploy, its new 700 MHz band operation in the Phoenix area during the summer of 2010. Engineering tests and interference analyses have revealed that Multimedia and Verizon may mutually and adversely interfere with each other with Verizon’s operation on 700 MHz in Globe/Miami if Multimedia continues to operate on Ch. 61. To avoid this potential interference, and to permit Verizon to operate in the Globe/Miami area as authorized pending Mexican approval and grant of Multimedia’s Construction Permit for operation on Ch. 48, FCC staff in the Media Bureau and International Bureau have recommended that Multimedia obtain an STA for operation on Ch. 48. Multimedia confirmed this recommendation by independent discussions with FCC staff in both bureaus, both of whom approve this application. The instant legal STA application is accordingly filed.

Due to Verizon’s upcoming schedule for deployment in this market, and the time necessary for Multimedia to activate operation on Ch. 48, Multimedia respectfully requests that the FCC expeditiously grant this STA application.

Neither Multimedia nor any party to this request is subject to denial of Federal benefits pursuant to Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, 21 U.S.C. § 853a.
