KXML Channel 260C0
Fairfield, ID
Section 307(b) Analysis Engineering**

By the instant minor change application, it is proposed to modify the authorization for KXML from Channel 260A at Salmon, ID to Channel 260C0 at Fairfield, ID.¹ Unless otherwise noted, all population numbers are from the 2000 Census.

Spacing Study

A single site is being used for the proposed allotment site and the proposed transmitter site. The site is an existing tower site on Picabo Mountain. The attached spacing study shows that the proposed Fairfield 260C0 allotment site meets the co-channel and adjacent channel spacing requirements for Class C0 stations as prescribed in §73.207 of the Commission's Rules, with two exceptions, neither of which require protection as described below. The proposed allotment and transmitter site is mutually-exclusive with the existing KXML authorization on Channel 260A at Salmon.

KZDX Channel 260C Burley

The spacing study indicates an apparent short-spacing to the licensed operation of station KZDX on Channel 260C at Burley, Idaho. However, per the Report and Order in MB Docket No. 05-243² that station was reallocated to Channel 228C at Burley. That action is now effective and final, and KZDX holds a construction permit for operation on Channel 228C at Burley (BPH-20080331APM, granted on 5/16/2008). Per the policy enunciated in

Auburn, Alabama,³ no further protection of the KZDX licensed facility on Channel 260C is required. It is understood that the resulting KXML construction permit (if issued prior to licensing of KZDX on Channel 228C) would bear a condition requiring activation of the new KZDX facility prior to or simultaneous with activation of the proposed KXML facility.

KSNQ Channel 261C1 Twin Falls

The underlying KXML modification application BMPH-20080411AHN was filed on April 11, 2008. Eighteen days later on April 29, 2008, Intermart Broadcasting Twin Falls, Inc. ("Intermart") file an application BPH-20080429AAC proposing a non-adjacent channel change for its station KSNQ Twin Falls, to operate on Channel 261C1. The KSNQ application is short-spaced by 131 kilometers to the KXML application BMPH-20080411AHN to which the instant amendment is being filed. Therefore, the KSNQ application is "in queue" behind BMPH-20080411AHN, and no protection of the KSNQ application is required.

First Local Service to Fairfield

The attached contour map demonstrates that the proposed allotment will provide 70 dBu service to 100% of Fairfield.

The proposed operation will provide the first local service to Fairfield, an incorporated city with a 2000 Census population of 395 persons. The FCC considers a town or city to be a community for allotment purposes when it is either incorporated or listed in the US Census. The community of Salmon will retain local service from AM station KSRA 960 kHz and FM station KSRA 224A. Therefore, the instant proposal represents a preferential arrangement of allotments under Priority 3.

Fairfield has a Mayor and City Council form of government. The current Mayor is David Hanks, and the City Council is comprised of Jerry Young, Jay Cutler, Terry Lee, and Boni Peters. Businesses

in town include restaurants, grocery market, sporting goods store, bars, hardware-feed store, newspaper and print shop, small retail and specialty shops, full service salon, and community childcare.⁴

No “Tuck” Analysis Required

The proposed operation of KXML on Channel 260C0 at Fairfield will not provide 70 dBu service to any portion of any Urbanized Area. Therefore, no “Tuck” analysis is required as a part of this proposal.

Gain and Loss Areas

The gain area associated with the reallocation of KXML encompasses an area of 21,852 sq km and a population of 91,829 persons. The loss area associated with the reallocation of KXML encompasses an area of 2,516 sq km and a population of 6,502 persons.

There will be a net increase of service provided by KXML to 85,327 persons.

While one service will be removed from the Salmon, Idaho, area, that is not believed to be an impediment to the instant proposal because KXML is not an operational licensed station.⁵ The Commission has previously stated that the loss of a potential service does not raise the same level of concern as that of an existing service.⁶ Therefore, grant of the instant proposal would be consistent with precedent and in the public interest, and represents a preferential arrangement of allotments.
