Red Bluff Joint Union High School District

The licensee has been serving the students in the Red Bluff, California area since 1897. The school was established by an election held on May 8, 1897 pursuant to amendments to the high school law passed by the California Legislature in 1896-97. On June 9, 1897, one trustee from each of the eleven elementary districts served by the school was elected to the new school board. The school opened on September 6, 1897 on the upper floor of the Lincoln Street School, which was its home until the construction of the first high school building in 1907.

The licensee operates a main campus, a school farm, a continuation school, an independent study center and four alternative education sites. The district also cooperates in several programs. There are standard, vocational, ROP and college preparatory curricula.

KRBH LP FM officially launched on September 5, 2002 on 107.7 FM. Since that time the LPFM station has taught students in communications technology, business, and marketing,. Under supervision, students are engaged in all phases of operating the station, including maintenance, compliance with FCC regulations, marketing, underwriting, and management of a music library, scheduling, audio production and live broadcasting.

KRBH LP FM students produce public service and informative files based upon their station duties. Students produce programs on local history, science and the environment, Agriculture news and health issues. The station broadcasts works by music and drama students as well as coverage of school athletic events.

The licensee also communicates with parents and the public at large about important issues as well as to announce special bad weather schedules. We use the bilingual talents of students and faculty to improve communications with our rapidly growing Hispanic population to produce education, information and music programs for Spanish speaking listeners.

Finally during the evening and weekend hours, the station broadcasts programs produced by student and faculty These programs will be selected and approved by the stations management based upon their value to the station's and district's overall educational goals.
