

### **W292DZ, Orlando, Florida—Minor Changes Since 2005**

To allay concerns about site “hopping” the licensee provides the following summary of the minor changes for this translator since 2005:

- BPFT-20101214ABQ, **no site change**, frequency changed from 90.3 to 95.9 on a displacement basis to accommodate a new NCE-FM on 90.3 at Eustis, FL. The facility was constructed and licensed.
- BPFT-20110225ACO, **no site change**, frequency changed from 95.9 to 96.1 to accommodate a site move by co-owned W239BS, Mount Dora, Florida. The facility was constructed and licensed.
- BPFT-20110812ABW, **first site change since 2005**, to accommodate loss of tower space at the 2005 site and to change city to Mount Dora, Florida. The facility was constructed and licensed.
- BPFT-20111107AMQ, **no site change** from BPFT-20110812ABW, but changed frequency from 96.1 to 95.7 to broaden opportunities for development of this translator. The facility was constructed and licensed.
- BPFT-20120127AIO, **second site change since 2005**, also changed the frequency from 95.7 to 106.3 and made W292DZ a fill-in translator for co-owned WPOZ (HD-3), Union Park, Florida. The translator is currently on the air with these facilities.
- The pending application, which reflects only the **third site change since 2005**, proposes a move to a location where the licensee operates two other translators, W273CA and W240BV. Applications were simultaneously filed for those two translators proposing triplexed operations with the facilities proposed in this application. W292DZ will remain a fill-in for WPOZ(HD-3)

The licensee has had reasonable assurance of site availability for all three sites on the basis of its having entered into standard leases covering all three . W292DZ is already licensed to Orlando, Florida, and is not engaged in a “move in” to the market. W292DZ has changed sites only twice in the past seven years. The current application proposes co-location with two other co-owned translators, thereby offering efficient and economical operations by the licensee, which is a not-for-profit NCE entity. On the basis of the foregoing, it is submitted that the licensee has not, either now or in the past, engaged in site “hopping” that violates the minor change rule.
