WHAZ-FM Request for non-directional STA

Extraordinary Circumstances that motivate process and approval of this Request

As annotated by Capital Media Corporation (CMC) in our request for a Special Temporary Authorization (STA) to be silent, in an abrupt turn of events during negotiations for an extension, our Mt. Anthony main transmitter site lease was cancelled.

CMC's plan to return to the air utilizing a previous site (see BPH-940331IC) has taken somewhat longer to organize than anticipated but the approval of this STA application at that site will permit WHAZ-FM to return to the air quickly utilizing the existing non-directional antenna and support equipment.

An application for a construction permit for full power operation from this same location utilizing a directional antenna reminiscent to the original licensed facility at this site will be filed shortly after a grant of this STA request.

As the tower*, necessary site support improvements, such as electric service, all municipal permitting for Radio Frequency use, are in place, we anticipate that with a grant of this instant STA request, WHAZ-FM can return to the air near immediately.

This return to air, even with a reduced signal, will benefit much of the service area as well as the licensee for multiple reasons :

- Provide service immediately to much of the service area now and through the period until full power is restored

- Provide some breathing room to properly and accurately prepare our full power application

- Once the directional full power construction permit application is approved, a specially fabricated directional antenna will be needed that engenders further delays and again, service can be maintained on a continuous basis through this delay period.

The FAA approval study is 2004-AEA-2844-OE. Since the FAA found the tower as built to be unconditionally not a hazard and since the overall height is under 200 ft AGL, no lighting or ASR is required. Former owners used this site well into the previous decade.
