San Francisco-Oakland-San José, California DMA

The triggering of the Commission's local radio ownership rule, 47 C.F.R. Section 73.3555(a), and the radio-television cross-ownership rule, 47 C.F.R. Section 73.3555(c), due to the attributable, non-controlling interests of certain parties to the Transferee will not have any adverse effect on the multiplicity of media voices in the San Francisco-Oakland-San José, California area because, as demonstrated herein, the area's residents have access to a large variety of local broadcast and non-broadcast media.

The San Francisco-Oakland-San José, California Designated Market Area (the "San Francisco DMA") is ranked as the sixth largest market in the nation by Nielsen Media Research. ^{1/} As set forth in Table F-1 hereto, the San Francisco Arbitron Metro radio market has 18 independent television voices and 70 independent media voices, as calculated pursuant to 47 C.F.R. Section 73.3555(c)(3), far in excess of the eight independent television voices and 20 independent media voices required for a two television/six radio station combination. Likewise, the independent voice thresholds are far exceeded in the San José Arbitron Metro radio market, with its 18 independent television voices and 38 independent media voices. ^{2/}

The San Francisco DMA has a total of 23 commercial and non-commercial full-power television stations. ^{3/} These 23 television stations include affiliates of ABC, CBS, NBC, FOX and PBS, as well as eight independent stations providing local programming to

San Francisco-Oakland-San José residents. ^{4/} Additionally, these 23 television stations today are owned by 18 different entities, and the proposed transfer of control will not change this diversity of television ownership. In addition to the full-power television stations, there are 16 low-power television stations (including three Class A stations) in the San Francisco DMA, including, for example, a station that provides Korean and Vietnamese language programming (KFTL-CA, San Francisco). ^{5/} Indeed, it is precisely for these reasons and others that the Commission has described the media market in San Francisco as “very diverse and competitive.” ^{6/}

The San Francisco DMA also is served by a vibrant and diverse radio market, including 73 FM stations and 32 AM stations. ^{7/} The radio services available to residents in San Francisco DMA include children’s programming (*e.g.*, KMKY(AM), Oakland), Spanish-language programming (*e.g.*, KZSF(AM), San José; KRZZ(FM), San Francisco; KIQI(AM), San Francisco), Chinese-language programming (*e.g.*, KSJX(AM), San José), Vietnamese-language programming (*e.g.*, KVVN(AM), San José), news programming (*e.g.*, KCBS(AM), San Francisco; KGO(AM), San Francisco) and religious programming (*e.g.*, KEAR(FM), San Francisco), in addition to a wide variety of other talk and music formats. ^{8/}

The San Francisco-Oakland-San José market also is well served by multi-channel video programming distributors (“MVPDs”). Over 89 percent of households in the San Francisco DMA subscribe to some form of MVPD service, 9/ most commonly cable television service, which has a penetration rate of 77 percent (1,805,920 households) in the DMA and is provided over 52 separate cable systems owned by 11 different cable operators. 10/

DBS providers EchoStar and DirecTV also serve subscribers in the San Francisco DMA, and both offer local-into-local delivery of broadcast television stations to their subscribers. 11/ San Francisco-Oakland-San José residents also have access to two Satellite Digital Audio Radio Services, Sirius and XM Radio, each offering nearly 200 digital audio channels. 12/

With respect to the newspaper market, eight daily and 50 weekly newspapers are published in the San Francisco DMA, including a number of Spanish-language publications, (*e.g. El Tecolote, El Mundo, El Latino, El Bohemio News, El Mensajero, Nuevo Mundo, and El Observador*) and many other publications cater to the particularized needs, interests and concerns of communities within the DMA, including *Oakland Post, Russian Life, Hokubei*

Mainichi, Nichi Bei Times, Chinese Times, Jewish News Weekly of Northern California, SF Weekly, San Francisco Bay Guardian and Viet Mercury. 13/

Furthermore, San Francisco area residents have access to the Internet, which provides access to an unprecedented number of media outlets, including online versions of many of the newspapers listed in Table F-6 and websites for many of the radio and television stations listed in Table F-3 and F-4. In addition to traditional dial-up and broadband access to the Internet, the city of San Francisco is currently in negotiations with Google and EarthLink to develop a citywide Wi-Fi network, which will help bridge the digital divide and provide even greater access to the Internet. 14/

Given the presence of strong competition and the diversity of voices in the San Francisco DMA, grant of the limited waiver sought is consistent with Commission precedent and would serve the public interest by facilitating the prompt consummation of the proposed multi-station, multi-market transaction and an orderly process for achieving compliance with the Commission's ownership rules.
