PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Venture Technologies Group, LLC (“VTG”), by its attorney and pursuant to Section 1.106 of the Commission’s rules, hereby requests reconsideration of the Commission’s dismissal of the above-referenced application seeking to move low power television station KMRZ-LD (“KMRZ”), Los Angeles, California (Facility ID No. 167312), from channel 22 to channel 6.¹ KMRZ sought displacement relief due to interference it experiences on channel 22 from co- and adjacent channels. The FCC denied the application based on failure to obtain Mexican concurrence.

VTG requests reinstatement of the KMRZ displacement application so that it may propose an amendment that it believes will receive Mexican concurrence. Specifically, once VTG’s displacement application is reinstated, VTG will file an amendment to the pending application to reduce KMRZ’s power level. Because the application otherwise complies with the

Commission's rules, it is within the public interest to reconsider and grant KMRZ's displacement application.

For these reasons, VTG respectfully requests that the Bureau immediately reconsider its dismissal of KMRZ's displacement application.
