

### **Explanation Regarding Filing**

Miami Valley Broadcasting Corporation (“Miami”) is the licensee of WHIO-TV, Dayton, Ohio, (Facility ID No. 41458). WHIO-TV is in the same employment unit as four radio stations licensed to Cox Radio, Inc. (“Cox”):

Cox and Miami are commonly owned by Cox Media Group (together, “Cox Dayton”).

The FCC has stated that when an employment unit consists of television and radio stations that are part of the same renewal group, the filing schedule for television should be used for purposes of filing the mid-term report (FCC Form 397) for the employment unit. *See* Review of the Commission’s Broadcast and Cable Equal Employment Opportunity Rules and Policies, *Second Report and Order and Third Notice of Proposed Rulemaking*, 17 FCC Rcd 24018 (2002) at ¶ 150. Accordingly, the Cox Dayton employment group is filing its FCC Form 397 according to the schedule for WHIO-TV. However, television and radio stations currently file their FCC Form 397 reports in different databases and the Commission’s LMS electronic filing system for television does not currently permit the inclusion of radio licenses on television reports. Accordingly, Cox Dayton is simultaneously filing its FCC Form 397 report for its Dayton employment unit in CDBS (to accommodate the radio stations) and in LMS (to accommodate its TV station).
