

DEMONSTRATION OF COMPLAINT WITH COMMUNITY OF LICENSE COVERAGE RULES

This application proposes a channel sharing arrangement between WYDN(TV), Worcester, Massachusetts (Fac. ID 18783) and WPXG-TV, Concord, NH (Fac. ID 48406), whereby WYDN will broadcast using WPXG-TV's transmission facilities.

Under Section 73.625(a) of the Commission's Rules, a full power UHF television station's DTV transmitter must provide a 48 dBu contour over the station's entire principal community to be served. As demonstrated in the attached contour map, WPXG-TV's 48 dBu contour does not cover WYDN's principal community of Worcester, Massachusetts. However, in the Incentive Auction Report and Order, the Commission determined that proposed sharees "may propose licensed community changes if they cannot satisfy signal coverage requirements from their new transmitter sites, provided that the new communities meet the same allotment priorities as the current ones and are located in the same Designated Market Areas." *In the Matter of Expanding the Econ. & Innovation Opportunities of Spectrum Through Incentive Auctions*, Report & Order, 29 FCC Rcd. 6567 ¶¶ 27, 374-77 (2014). The Commission further stated that "[i]n the unlikely event that the sharee cannot identify any community that meets the same or a higher allotment priority at its new shared site, it must choose a new community of license to which it will provide the next highest priority." *Id.* ¶ 376 n. 1117.

Upon commencement of channel sharing, WYDN proposes to change its community of license to Lowell, Massachusetts. Lowell has "a [2010] U.S. Census population of [106,519] persons, its own local government, police and fire departments and educational institutions, as well as numerous religious institutions and businesses." *See In the Matter of Amendment of Section 73.622(I), Post-Transition Table of DTV Allotments*, 26 FCC Rcd. 32 (MB 2011). Worcester and Lowell are both located in the Boston, Massachusetts Designated Market Area. Moreover, as demonstrated in the attached contour map, WPXG-TV's 48 dBu contour covers Lowell in its entirety.

Finally, Lowell meets a greater allotment priority than Worcester. The Commission's allotment priorities are to: (1) provide at least one television service to all parts of the country; (2) provide each community with at least one television broadcast station; (3) provide a choice of at least two television services to all parts of the country; (4) provide each community with at least two television broadcast stations; and (5) assign any remaining channels to communities based on population, geographic location, and the number of television services available to the community from stations located in other communities. *Amendment of Section 3.606 of the Commission's Rules and Regulations*, Sixth Report and Order, 41 FCC 148, 167 (1952). As demonstrated in the attached report from BIA/Kelsey, WYDN currently provides a second local service to Worcester, placing it in the allotment priority 4. With the proposed change, WYDN would provide a first local service to Lowell, placing it in a higher allotment priority. Accordingly, the proposed change is consistent with the Incentive Auction Rules and Section 307(b) of the Communications Act.

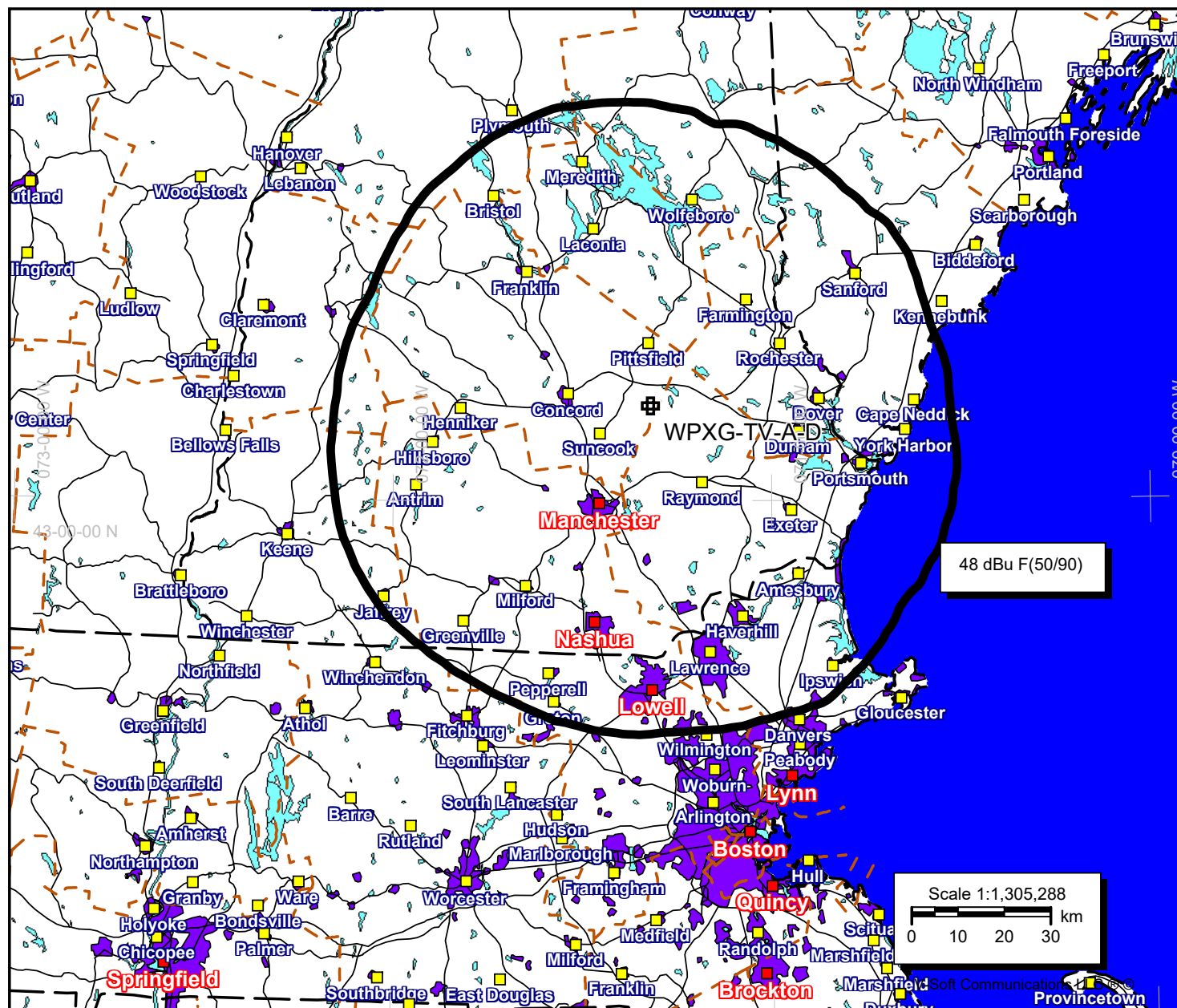
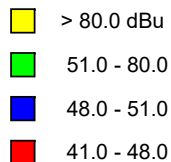

History

The City of Lowell was founded in 1826 as a planned industrial city, and incorporated as a City in 1836. Situated 28 miles northwest of Boston, and with a growing population exceeding 100K, Lowell is the fourth largest municipality in Massachusetts.

Selection

By charter, the City of Lowell follows a Plan E Form of government, in which the popular vote of the City of Lowell's residents elects nine members to the City Council to serve a two year term of office. City Councilors then elect one of their members to serve as City Mayor, who serves as the official head of the City, presiding over City Council and School Committee meetings.

Appointments

The City Council appoints:

- A City Auditor, to be responsible for the approval, payment, and recording of all financial transactions for the City.
- A City Clerk, to be responsible as the administrator to the legislative function of City government.
- A City Manager, to be responsible for the administration of the City day-to-day affairs.

Role

Among its duties, the City Council:

- Responds to citizens and community groups seeking information or assistance
- Votes on:
 - Bond issues
 - Certain organizational or advisory appointees
 - Grants
 - Land acquisitions and sales
 - Loans
 - Other financial appropriations
 - Proposed city budgets
 - Traffic control issues
 - Zoning changes

Numerous City Council Subcommittees work with various constituents and departments on execution of City services and activities, and review proposed plans, ordinances, resolutions, and orders before they are voted on by the full City Council.

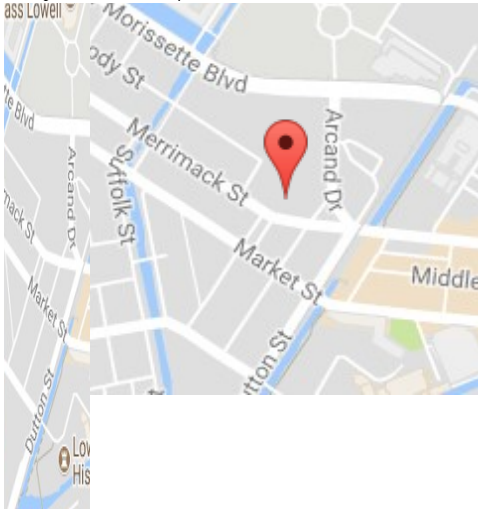

The mission of the Lowell Fire Department is to improve the quality of life in the City of Lowell by providing fire protection, emergency response services, fire prevention, and activities with the public educational department. Our goal is to protect all citizens, their property and the environment from natural and man-made disasters.

Our motto is Promoting Safety, Preventing Fires and Saving Lives. We strive to accomplish this in a courteous, professional manner.

Department Overview

The Lowell Fire Department has 13 companies strategically located around the city. These companies provide services to but are not limited to that neighborhood. The LFD does not just respond to fires. In addition to fire incidents, the LFD responds to calls for emergency medical services, hazardous materials incidents, ice and water rescues/recoveries, automobile accidents, including extrications, and technical and high-angle rescues. The Administration, the Fire Prevention Bureau, the Fire Investigation Unit, and the Hazardous Materials Division all work together as one team to educate the community and develop various programs to meet our community's needs.

Several grants have been awarded to support our comprehensive fire public education program targeting elementary school students, which was established in 1995. Our fire prevention unit has become a pro-active office for inspecting and monitoring residential and commercial fire safety installations.

Training & Education

Training and education are paramount to fulfilling the mission of the Fire Department. All members are trained to First Responder Level. In addition, 2 of our uniformed members are Massachusetts Licensed EMT Paramedics and 109 of our uniformed members are certified Massachusetts Emergency Medical Technicians.

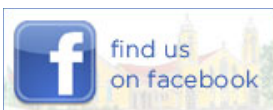
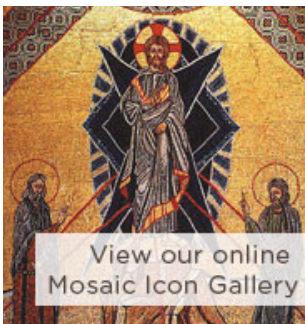

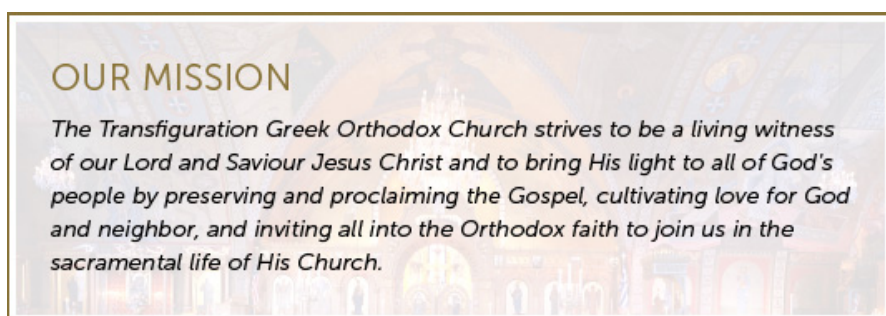
