

COMMUNITY OF LICENSE COVERAGE RULES

This application proposes a channel sharing arrangement between WSFJ-TV, Newark, Ohio (Fac. ID 11118) and WCLL-CD, Columbus, Ohio (Fac. ID 30244), whereby WSFJ will broadcast using WCLL-CD's transmission facilities.

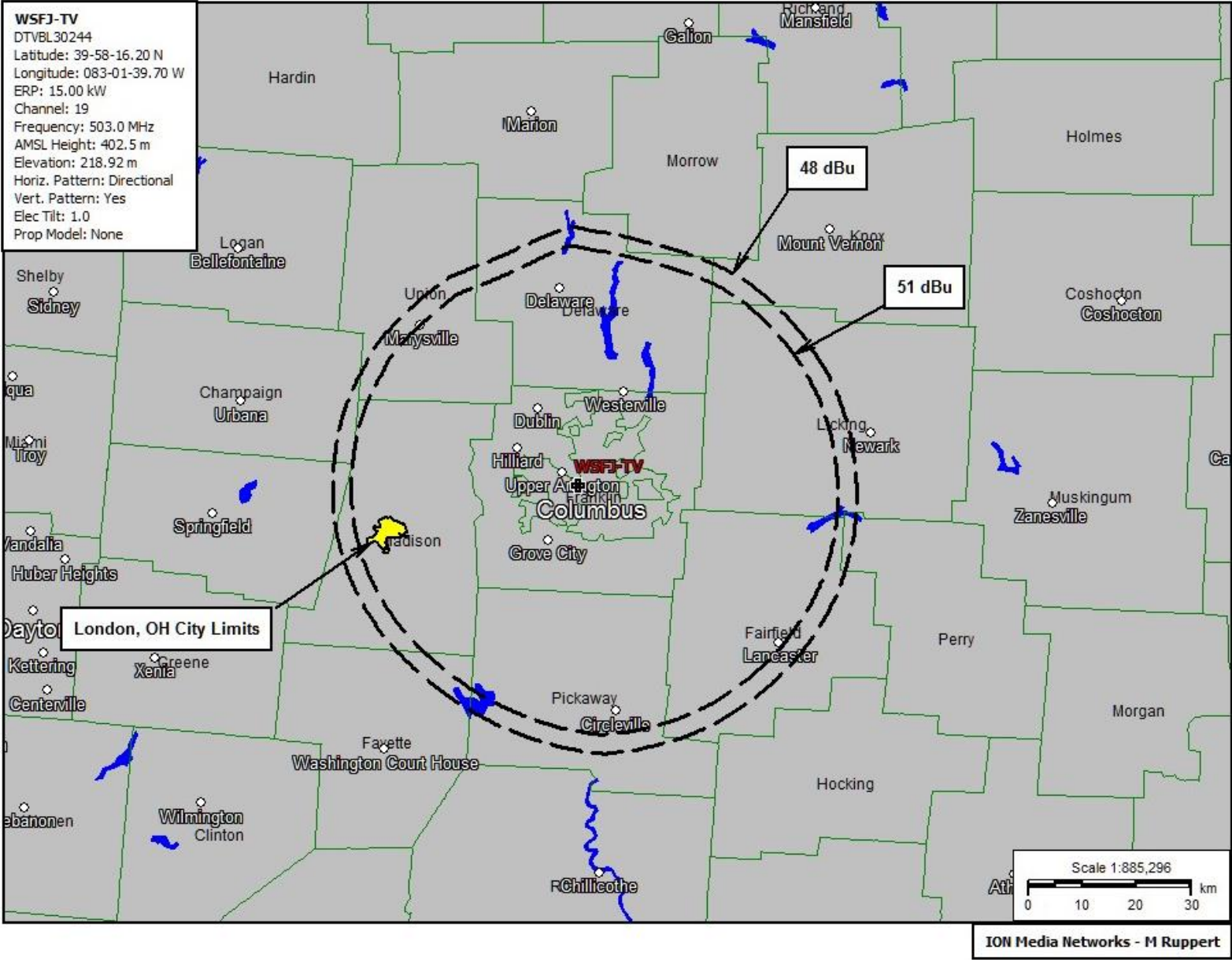
As demonstrated in the attached contour map, WCLL-CD's 48 dBu and 51 dBu contours do not cover WSFJ-TV's principal community of Newark, Ohio.¹ However, in the Incentive Auction Report and Order, the Commission determined that proposed sharees "may propose licensed community changes if they cannot satisfy signal coverage requirements from their new transmitter sites, provided that the new communities meet the same allotment priorities as the current ones and are designated in the same Designated Market Areas." *In the Matter of Expanding the Econ. & Innovation Opportunities of Spectrum through Incentive Auctions*, Report & Order, 29 FCC Rcd. 6567, paras. 27, 374-77 (2014). The Commission further stated that "[i]n the unlikely event that the sharee cannot identify any community that meets the same or a higher allotment priority as its new shared site, it must choose a new community of license to which it will provide the next highest priority." *Id.* para 376 n. 1117.

Upon commencement of channel sharing, WSFJ-TV proposes to change its community of license to London, Ohio. London has "a [2010] U.S. Census population of [9,904] persons, its own local government, police and fire departments and educational institutions, as well as numerous religious institutions and businesses." *See In the Matter of Amendment of Section 73.622(i), Post-Transition Table of DTV Allotments*, 26 FCC Rcd. 32 (MB 2011). London and Newark are both located in the Columbus, Ohio Designated Market Area. Moreover, as demonstrated in the attached contour map, WCLL-CD's 51 dBu protected contour covers London in its entirety.

Finally, London meets the same allotment priority as Newark. The Commission's allotment priorities are to: (1) provide at least one television service to all parts of the country; (2) provide each community with at least one television broadcast station; (3) provide a choice of at least two television services to all parts of the country; (4) provide each community with at least two television broadcast stations; (5) assign any remaining channels to communities based on population, geographic location, and the number of television services available to the community from stations located in other communities. *Amendment of Section 3.606 of the Commission's Rules and Regulations*, Sixth Report and Order, 41 FCC 148, 167 (1952). As demonstrated in the attached report from BIA/Kelsey, WSFJ-TV provides a first local service to Newark, placing it in the allotment priority 2. With the proposed change, WSFJ-TV would provide a first local service to London, placing it in the same allotment priority. Accordingly, the proposed change is consistent with the Incentive Auction Rules and Section 307(b) of the Communications Act.

¹ Class A television stations do not have a contour coverage requirement, so WCLL-CD's protected contour has been used to determine WSFJ-TV's signal coverage of the proposed community of license. *See* 47 C.F.R. § 73.6010.

Columbia Gas of Ohio Pipeline Replacement

Columbia Gas of Ohio investing more than \$1 million in London as part of Pipeline Replacement Program

Replacing over two miles of pipeline to increase reliability and enhance safety

LONDON, Ohio -- Columbia Gas of Ohio (COH) is investing approximately \$1 million in the City of London this year through a major pipeline replacement project. The company will upgrade over two miles of natural gas main lines and close to 150 customer service lines to increase reliability, enhance safety and reduce maintenance in years to come.

The project is expected to start (next week/August 28, 2017,) and all construction is estimated to be completed by the middle of November. It includes work on a number of streets:

- Mound Street
- Wickline Avenue
- Antietam Avenue
- Jenkinson Avenue
- Lincoln Avenue
- Fairview Street
- Toland Avenue
- Olive Street
- West Center Street
- Sherman Avenue
- Highland Avenue
- Shady Avenue
- Richardson Avenue
- Midway Street

For customers in the project scope the construction work requires a temporary interruption of natural gas service. COH will personally contact customers to schedule the work at their residence or business. Customers with indoor meters will have their meters relocated to the outside of their premises, service lines replaced, and all property disturbed as a result of the activity will be restored. This work will be done at no additional cost to the customer.

These projects are part of the company's larger 25-year program to invest more than \$2 billion to replace over 4,000 miles of pipeline in neighborhoods across the state. By replacing the aging cast iron and bare steel pipe with new infrastructure it reduces leaks. As a result, the number of leaks

have fallen 40 percent since the program started.

In addition, some of the pipe being replaced was installed prior to 1950 and the property taxes have greatly depreciated over time. Since 2008, Columbia Gas has paid close to \$100 million in additional property taxes in Ohio, which directly supports local governments and schools.
