Re: Notification of New Post-Incentive  
Auction Transition Linked Station  
KFTV-DT, Hanford, CA  
Facility ID No. 34439

Dear Licensee,

This letter is to inform you that KFTV-DT, Hanford, California (KFTV-DT), is part of a new linked station set and is required to coordinate the testing and commencement of operations on its post-auction channel with KSEE(TV), Fresno, California (KSEE).<sup>1</sup> This coordination is necessary because KSEE's post-auction channel recently was changed from channel 16 to channel 20, and its transition phase assignment was changed from Phase 1 to Phase 10.<sup>2</sup>

In the *Closing and Channel Reassignment Public Notice*, KSEE was assigned to transition Phase 1.<sup>3</sup> The *Transition Scheduling Adoption Public Notice* prescribes that a temporary increase in pairwise (station-to-station) interference of up to two percent during the post-incentive auction transition period is permissible.<sup>4</sup> Commission staff has conducted a technical analysis and determined that as a result of the channel change, if KSEE were to complete its transition to its new post-auction channel during Phase 1, KFTV-DT would receive and cause interference in excess of the permissible threshold with full power television KMAX-TV. Specifically, Commission staff found that KFTV-DT would receive and cause 98.5 percent pairwise interference with KSEE. Commission staff determined that modifying KSEE's phase assignment to Phase 10 and creating a new linked station set with KFTV-DT would result in both



station's satisfying the interference levels permitted under the *Transition Scheduling Adoption Public Notice*.<sup>5</sup>

Accordingly, KFTV-DT **MUST COORDINATE** commencement of testing and operations on its post-auction channel with KSEE. This required coordination with KSEE **DOES NOT** impact KFTV-DT's current assignment to transition Phase 10, which has a testing period start date of May 2, 2020, and phase completion date of July 3, 2020.
