Dear Mr. Block:

Kentucky Authority for Educational Television ("KET") hereby consents to a grant of the pending request that you filed with the FCC for special temporary authority ("STA"), to operate Station WBQC-LD, FCC Facility ID 168413, temporarily on Channel 20, as proposed in LMS File No. 0000058280 (the "Consent").

KET's consent is conditioned as follows: (1) WBQC-LD will operate at the same transmitter site with not more than the antenna height and pattern and the power formerly used by WOTH-CD, Facility ID 168414, when WOTH-CD operated on Channel 20 under license file number BLDTA-20121105ALZ; and (2) KET's Consent to the STA will expire, and WBQC-LD must cease operation on Channel 20, not later than the date on which WLWT, Facility ID 46979, commences operation on Channel 20, currently scheduled on or about October 18, 2019; (3) WBQC-LD will pay KET the amount of Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500.00) to cover KET's time and effort relating to this Consent, including KET's out of pocket legal and engineering expenses in evaluating and negotiating this Consent.

This Consent will not be effective until you have paid the amount specified above and countersigned this letter. By countersigning, you agree to accept the conditions specified in the previous paragraph of this letter.
