

This concerns the above-referenced displacement applications for digital low power television stations filed by Serestar Communications Corporation (SCC), licensee of KMMW-LD, Stockton, California, and Cocola Broadcasting Companies, LLC (Cocola), licensee of KSAO-LD, Sacramento, California. You have submitted a settlement agreement to resolve the mutual exclusivity among these applications. Pursuant to the settlement agreement, Cocola has agreed to amend its application to resolve the mutual exclusivity between the two pending applications.
