

AMENDMENT –
MUTUAL ACCEPTANCE OF INTERFERENCE

By this amendment, Oklahoma Community Television, L.L.C. (“OCT”), the licensee of K45JZ-D, Elk City, Oklahoma (FIN 168301) (“K45JZ-D”), submits additional information to resolve any mutual exclusivities with other facilities, so that the instant displacement application can be processed by Commission staff.

OCT is a subsidiary of Griffin Licensing, L.L.C. (“Griffin”). As of February 28, 2019, Griffin is the permittee of unbuilt TV translator facility K32KA-D, channel 32, Clinton, Oklahoma (FIN 185584) (“K32KA-D”).¹

On September 15, 2017, during the Special Displacement Window,² OCT filed a displacement application for K45JZ-D, proposing operations on channel 32 (File No. 0000029966) (the “K45JZ-D Displacement Application”). Commission staff have advised OCT that a study of the K45JZ-D Displacement Application reveals that it is predicted to cause interference to the authorization of K32KA-D.

An analysis of the predicted interference from K45JZ-D to K32KA-D indicates that the area of predicted interference is minimal and unlikely to cause material interference issues for either facility.

In view of these facts, and in view of the common ownership of K45JZ-D and K32KA-D, OCT and Griffin hereby notify the Commission of their non-objection to the proposed operations of K45JZ-D on channel 32, as set forth in the K45JZ-D Displacement Application, and of K32KA-D’s acceptance of the predicted interference from the facilities proposed in the K45JZ-D Displacement Application, with the understanding that the K45JZ-D Displacement Application is otherwise eligible for grant.
