Online Public Inspection File

The applicant has responded in the affirmative to the FCC online public inspection file certification that states: “Licensee certifies that the documentation required by 47 C.F.R. Section 73.3526 or 73.3527, as applicable, has been uploaded to the station’s public inspection file as and when required.” The applicant wishes to note the following that may be relevant to the foregoing certification:

- The station’s license authorization is not available at the “View License Authorization” link in the FCC online public inspection file. When clicked, the link generates a document that states “Authorization not yet created by MB.” After discovering this, the applicant scanned a paper copy of the station’s license and uploaded it to the “Additional Documents” section of its FCC online public inspection file.
- The applicant was unable to file the station’s Fourth Quarter 2018 issues/programs list on January 10, 2019, due to the federal government shutdown. The applicant filed the issues/programs list after the FCC online public inspection file became available once the federal government reopened after the shutdown.
- The station’s Employment Unit inadvertently failed to timely file its FCC 397 Broadcast Mid-Term Report, which was due Monday, August 3, 2015. Promptly upon discovery of this omission, the Employment Unit filed the report on August 7, 2015.
- The station’s Employment Unit inadvertently failed to timely file its 2014 EEO audit materials in connection with its transition to the station’s FCC online public inspection file. Promptly upon discovery of this omission, the Employment Unit uploaded those material to the “EEO Audits, Investigations and Complaints” section of its FCC online public inspection file.

The applicant respectfully submits that the foregoing are not material to the station’s overall compliance with Section 73.3526 of the rules.
