The quarterly issues/programs lists for 2013 and the 1st, 2nd and 3rd quarters of 2014, were uploaded on December 1, 2014, and the commercial limits certifications for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd quarters of 2014, were uploaded on December 10, 2014.

NBC's coverage of *French Open Tennis* on June 4, 2016, originally preempted *Astroblast*, *The Chica Show*, and *Noodle and Doodle* from their regularly scheduled time periods. These programs were scheduled to air makegoods later that day, however, *French Open Tennis* ran long and also preempted those makegoods. No further makegoods were scheduled for these programs. Consequently, in the 2nd quarter of 2016, WTLV aired less than three hours of children's E/I programming, as averaged over a 6-month period. During the quarter, the average weekly amount of children's television programming aired on the main stream was 2.92 hours (six-month averages that include either the 1st quarter or the 3rd quarter do not raise the weekly average to 3.0 hours).

It is the station's policy and practice to upload new and revised orders to its political file as soon as possible once an order or change has been accepted and processed. During periods of especially high activity, some political file updates may be delayed, particularly with respect to information revising ongoing orders or reconciling completed orders. Station personnel are available to answer questions from the public regarding any revision or reconciliation information not yet reflected in the station's political file. An internal audit of the station's political file, which was conducted in connection with the preparation of this renewal application and completed on September 24, 2020, identified 122 orders placed in 2018 that appear to have been uploaded to the

political file more than seven days after being placed. Based on the station's experience in 2018, the station revised its internal processes and staffing for maintaining the political file. The station has identified a total of 60 orders placed after 2018 that apparently had not been uploaded to the station's file within seven days, including eight orders placed in 2020 that the audit identified as missing.
