

## **Online Public Inspection File and Ownership Report Compliance**

KTJS is a rural AM station (1. kW daytime; 0.36 kW nighttime) located in Hobart, Kiowa County, OK (Hobart 2019 est. pop. 3427; Kiowa County 2019 est. pop. 8,708). The station's coverage population is quite small, and its regular listeners are likely, at most, in the low hundreds. Fuchs Radio, LLC ("Fuchs") the Licensee of KTJS also operates four other rural southwest Oklahoma radio stations. As a small operator with limited listeners and limited revenues, it has only three full-time employees and has not previously engaged FCC counsel.

Fuchs acknowledges that all Issues and Programs Lists for the current license period were uploaded into KTJS's OPIF late. Fuchs states that it had created all such Lists and had previously placed them in its paper Public Inspection File that it continued to keep. Except for an earlier filed List, all Issues and Programs Lists were just recently uploaded (after an OPIF audit performed by the FCC Counsel retained to assist with this late renewal filing).

Fuchs also acknowledges that it did not timely file Biennial Ownership Reports during the current license term. The most recent Biennial Ownership Report (showing ownership as of October 1, 2019) was filed over 3 months late. Fuchs advises however that the ownership of KTJS had not changed and that the OPIF always had an Ownership Report correctly identifying all ownership interests.

While KTJS was part of an Employment Unit ("EU") with five (5) or more full-time employees at the time it filed its last renewal application (and EEO Program Report) in 2013, that EU dropped below 5 full-time employees later in 2013 and has not had 5 or more fulltime employees since that time. (When KTJS uploaded its single EEO Annual Report in 2017, the report was not required because the EU had fewer than 5 full-time employees.)

Fuchs also acknowledges that it was late to upload materials to the KTJS Political File located in its OPIF. The materials (which were uploaded after the OPIF audit) related to a single request to run a political ad during the 2020 election cycle.

Having gained a new understanding of the regulatory requirements related to the OPIF and having engaged FCC counsel, Fuchs is committed to future OPIF and other Rules compliance.
