Public Inspection File

KQBU-FM, Port Arthur, TX (the “Station”) believes that it has generally met the requirement in Section 73.1943(c) of the FCC rules to post political orders to the online public inspection file “immediately, absent unusual circumstances.” The Station simulcasts the signal of co-owned station KAMA-FM, so that political orders on KAMA-FM are also simulcast on KQBU-FM. In 2018, such political orders were only post to the public file of KAMA-FM, the originating station. In an abundance of caution, all of the KAMA-FM political orders in 2019 and 2020 were posted to the political file of both the originating and the simulcast station. In an abundance of caution, the Station also reports the following:

- In 2019, the Station uploaded two spots for Orlando Sanchez, candidate for City of Houston Controller, to the public inspection file four days after the contract was finalized.
- In 2020, the Station uploaded a non-candidate spot placed by the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee 11 days after the contract was finalized.
