

Online Public Inspection File

Licensee believes that the Online Public Inspection File (“OPIF”) of WIIH-CD is substantially complete and that throughout the period of time covered by this application it substantially complied with the FCC’s rules regarding the OPIF. Nonetheless, Licensee cannot certify that all required documents were uploaded to the OPIF in a timely manner. Specifically, Licensee failed to upload WIIH-CD’s Quarterly Issues/Programs Lists for 2020 and its EEO public file report for the period ending March 31, 2020 by the applicable deadlines; those documents were all subsequently added to the OPIF. Licensee’s annual children’s programming report for 2020 was also filed 10 days late. Licensee also notes that certification of the station’s compliance with the requirements for Class A stations for calendar year 2020 was added to the file in 2021. Licensee’s annual children’s programming reports for 2019 and 2020 were amended following their original filing to correct inadvertent errors in calculation of core children’s programming hours.

Licensee is also unable to certify that at all times it maintained an up-to-date list of the documents required to be maintained under Section 73.3613 of the Commission’s rules, although Licensee believes that a current list of such documents was available in the Station’s ownership reports during the majority of the time covered by this renewal application. A separate and complete list of Section 73.3613 documents is now available in the Station’s OPIF.

Finally, licensee notes that WIIH-CD rebroadcasts the programming of commonly-owned WISH-TV. No requests for political air time have been received specifically related to WIIH-CD. Records concerning the paid political programming included in the programming of WISH-TV are maintained in that station’s public inspection file.
