**Petition to Deny**

Dear Counsel:

We have before us the above-referenced application (Auxiliary Application) for an auxiliary FM antenna for station KZAM(FM), Pleasant Valley, Texas (Station), filed on June 8, 2020, by Mekaddesh Group Corporation (Mekaddesh). We also have before us a petition to deny the Auxiliary Application filed by Matinee Media Corporation (Matinee) on July 7, 2020 (Petition to Deny).<sup>1</sup> On April 7, 2021, Mekaddesh filed an opposition to the Petition to Deny (Opposition).<sup>2</sup> For the reasons stated below, we deny the Petition to Deny and grant the Auxiliary Application.

**Background.** The Station is authorized to operate on a tower owned by Matinee (ASR No. 1262203) (Tower). In the Petition to Deny, Matinee states that, due to failure to pay its monthly fees, Mekaddesh “no longer has any legal right to use the Tower” after January 22, 2020.<sup>3</sup> Therefore, Matinee argues, Mekaddesh should not be authorized to operate an auxiliary antenna “for an indefinite or permanent period of time when an FM station did not have an authorized main facility it could use.”<sup>4</sup>

Because the Petition to Deny raised issues regarding the Station's operating status during 2020 and 2021, on March 3, 2021, the Audio Division, Media Bureau (Bureau) issued a letter of inquiry (LOI) requesting additional information regarding the Station's operation during that time period.<sup>5</sup> On April 5, 2021, Mekaddesh submitted a response to the LOI (LOI Response).<sup>6</sup> In both the LOI Response and Opposition, Mekaddesh states that on January 28, 2021, Matinee and Mekaddesh resolved their financial dispute by entering into a "Settlement and Purchase Agreement" under which, *inter alia*, Mekaddesh would purchase the Tower from Matinee.<sup>7</sup> Mekaddesh certifies that the Station resumed licensed operations from the Tower on February 11, 2021.<sup>8</sup> Finally, Mekaddesh asserts that "at no time would the auxiliary site ever have been used as a proxy for legal, permanent operations required by the Commission's rules."<sup>9</sup>

**Discussion.** Given the information disclosed in the LOI Response and Opposition, namely, that the dispute between the parties has been resolved and the Station has resumed operation at its licensed site, we conclude that the objections to the Auxiliary Application raised by Matinee in the Petition to Deny are now moot. Therefore, we deny the Petition to Deny and grant the Auxiliary Application.

**Conclusion/Actions.** For the reasons set forth above, IT IS ORDERED that Petition to Deny filed on July 7, 2020, by Matinee Media Corporation (Pleading File No. 117191) IS DENIED and the application for an auxiliary FM antenna for station KZAM(FM), Pleasant Valley, Texas (Station), filed on June 8, 2020, by Mekaddesh Group Corporation (Application File No. 115863) IS GRANTED, pursuant to Section 0.283 of the Commission's Rules.<sup>10</sup>
