

**EASTERN UTAH BROADCASTING COMPANY  
FORM 303-S LICENSE RENEWAL  
STATEMENT AS TO PUBLIC INSPECTION FILE RULE COMPLIANCE**

Applicant in reviewing its OPIF uploads for the purpose of filing this renewal application discovered that the 2019-2020 EEO Public File Report, while timely uploaded to the applicable station website, was not timely uploaded to the respective OPIF folders for EEO Public File Reports through an oversight which occurred as a result of staffing/quarantine issues during Covid-19 lockdown in May 2020. The applicant is thus answering this question “NO” for this de minimis omission which has been corrected. The applicant is responding to the application question concerning compliance with 47 CFR §73.3526, in particular, subsection (e )(7) concerning the EEO file.

Applicant recognizes the derogation of its responsibilities in this very narrow instance and has undertaken the necessary remedial work to bring its EEO subfile of its online public inspection file into compliance. It has appointed a single individual, Paul Anderson, the Station General Manager, to take charge of all future EEO public file matters and fully expects it will remain in compliance with its obligations in this matter going forward.

Applicant notes that it has a small staff that was further reduced due to COVID-19 restrictions and lacks the resources of larger, commercial network O&O or major affiliate stations. The Commission has recognized in this cycle of license renewals that the Commission’s interest is in having online public inspection files accurate as of the license renewal date. To that end, the Commission has announced that it is only where public inspection file compliance is not effectuated by the “deadline for filing a station’s renewal application will that failure result in any impact or adverse action involving the renewal application.” *Public Notice*, 34 FCC Rcd 1344 (MB 2019). Applicant submits that this is an appropriate policy that should be applicable to the Applicant in this instance, but is prepared to enter into any necessary compliance agreement that the Media Bureau or EEO Branch deems

necessary to ensure future compliance.
