

### W09AT EXHIBIT

The analog predecessor to Station W09AT-LD, Fajardo, PR (the “Station”), was destroyed in the fall of 2017 by Hurricane Maria. The licensee filed a “Request for Silent Authority of an Analog LPTV Translator Station” on November 7, 2017, which was granted on the same day. See LMS File No. 0000034983. A request to extend the silent authority was filed on April 25, 2018, and granted on August 17, 2018. See LMS File No. 0000053334. On August 30, 2018, the Commission released a Public Notice providing further guidance to licensees whose facilities had been impacted by Hurricanes Irma and Maria, including guidance for avoiding automatic cancellation of licenses for facilities that remained dark for 12 consecutive months. See *Media Bureau Provides Guidance for Broadcast Licensees Still Rebuilding in the Aftermath of Hurricanes Irma and Maria*, Public Notice, DA 18-901 (rel. Aug. 30, 2018). On September 11, 2018, the licensee filed a request for a further extension of its silent authority in accordance with the Public Notice, which was granted on December 13, 2018. See LMS File No. 0000059571. On March 4, 2019, the licensee filed an application for a digital flash cut, which was granted on March 5, 2019. See LMS File No. 0000068243. On March 4, 2019, the licensee filed a further extension request, citing the filing of the digital flash cut application, which was granted on March 29, 2019. See LMS File No. 0000068247. The licensee constructed the digital facility and filed a covering license application on September 5, 2019, which was granted on September 17, 2019. See LMS File No. 0000080938. The station has been in continuous operation since the completion of the digital flash cut.
