

Public File Exhibit (KXBN)

In the course of preparing this license renewal application, licensee undertook a review of the station's online public inspection file ("OPIF"). In that review, it was noted that its 2014 EEO Public File Report had not been uploaded to the station's OPIF, although it had been filed in the station's paper public inspection file. Station personnel had been told by the inspector conducting a mock inspection of the station pursuant to the state broadcasters' association program that the report did not need to be uploaded to the station's then-new OPIF. The report was uploaded to the station's OPIF on May 26, 2021. Licensee also discovered that there were technical errors with the uploads of its 2018 and 2019 EEO Public File Reports. Both reports were initially uploaded on May 30, 2019 (meaning the 2018 report was uploaded one year late and the 2019 report was timely), but those uploads are showing with errors in the FCC's system. Licensee reuploaded both reports on May 27, 2021. In addition, licensee discovered that its issues/programs ("I/P") list for Q4 2018 was uploaded two days late and its I/P list for Q2 2020 was uploaded two and a half months late. Finally, Cherry Creek has entered into a Consent Decree with the Commission to cover political broadcasting matters before May 14, 2021, so any noncompliance with the political file rules prior to that date is covered by the Consent Decree and has not been reviewed in connection with this application. Any instances of noncompliance after the effective date of the Consent Decree that have been discovered by Cherry Creek will be reported to the Commission as required by the Consent Decree.
