Exhibit Regarding Online Public Inspection File

In connection with preparing to submit its license renewal applications, Licensee found that in limited instances certain documents were missing from the online public file or were not uploaded in a timely manner. §73.3527(e).¹ Some documents in the station's political file were not uploaded in a timely manner as set forth in 47 C.F.R. §§73.3526 and 73.1943 of the FCC's rules. In addition, while the licensee has made diligent efforts, in certain situations, some information required under the rules may have been omitted.

Licensee is an affiliate of QueenB Radio Wisconsin, Inc. ("QBRW"). On February 26, 2021, the Media Bureau of the Federal Communications Commission (the "Bureau") and entered into a Consent Decree with QBRW, and some provisions of the Consent Decree also apply to QBRW's "affiliates, subsidiaries, predecessors-in-interest, and successors in interest," including Licensee.

QBRW entered into the Consent Decree for the purpose of terminating the Bureau's investigation into QBRW's compliance with Section 315(e)(3) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, and Section 73.1943(c) of the Commission's rules, relating to the maintenance of online political files. See File No. POL-020121-269239 (DA 21- 239). To resolve the matter, the Company agreed to implement a comprehensive Compliance Plan with respect to future compliance with Section 315(e)(3) and Section 73.1943(c).

In the Consent Decree, the Bureau agreed not to suspend the processing of future radio license renewal applications that QBRW and its affiliates file in the current renewal cycle (through August 2022) because of QBRW's inability to certify compliance with its public file obligations in those applications. Accordingly, Licensee requests that the instant renewal application be processed in the ordinary course.
