Educational Program Intention

Coalinga Public Broadcast Service is devoted to the education of music and public affairs. Moreover, our nonprofit is devoted to the dispersal of underground, rare music, and the exposure of creative art, while focusing on issues critical to West Hollywood, providing educational public affairs programming via the conduit of a free-form radio format.

Coalinga Public Broadcast Service's mission is to bolster creative arts and the independent music community. We feel strongly about supporting unique sounds, local musicians, avant-garde techniques, and underrepresented voices without selling out to a corporate sound.

Programming Implementation

Coalinga Public Broadcast Service intends to utilize its facilities to extend its educational mission to the airwaves by carrying:

- Experimental music programming
- Creative arts programming
- Allowing community members develop radio shows related to the education and history of rare and unusual music
- Training the underserved voices in our community on how to develop radio shows and podcasts that educate the community on issues regarding public affairs and the arts
- Provide a platform for locals interested in non-commercial content while providing the community on a number of civic related policies and issues

Coalinga Public Broadcast Service Public Participation would invite the public to participate in the radio station to learn the fundamentals of broadcasting, creating content and podcasts. Community members would learn how to play music on the radio, engineering, creating public affairs content in a supervised learning environment.

Coalinga Public Broadcast Service would implement a series of local and syndicated content. Syndicated content would be shows like Democracy Now, Extinction Diaries, and arts programming such as Arts Express Radio.
