In addition, Elizabeth and friends' personal hands-on experiences in the field both inspire teens to engage in selfless, helping behaviors in addition to educating them on where and how to find volunteer opportunities.

Each episode of Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World will be:

- at least 30 minutes in length;
- aired between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m.; and
- a regularly scheduled weekly program.

All programs will be delivered to network stations fully closed captioned.

EDUCATIONAL COMPONENTS

Elizabeth Stanton’s Great Big World is an invaluable addition to the core programming element of all broadcast networks. This in-depth, high definition travel show offers entertaining, safe, educational and informational programming appropriate for teens 13-16.

Through the use of on-site stand-ups, voice over monologues, subject interviews, environmental b-roll, volunteer experiences, and on-site social interactions with indigenous peoples and cultures, the show provides an educational journey to significant destinations around the world.

Listed below are several educational components built into the fabric of the program that would qualify it as an effective and engaging teaching aid for use in the home, the classroom, and/or any other educational media venue.

- **GEOGRAPHY:** Episodes include graphic maps and/or detailed audio descriptions of where in the world the subject country/city is located. Major land formations and the general terrain are also described and shown in high definition detail.

- **DEVELOPMENT OF CULTURE:** Episodes provide an in-depth look at everyday life around the world - often including personal interviews with native residents of the subject country/city.
- **VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES:** Each new episode brings Elizabeth and friends to a new part of the world where the need for outside help is persistent, necessary, and dependent upon the global issue specific to the environment. Volunteer opportunities and global issues are both age appropriate and presented in a thoughtful and responsible manner.
- **SOCIAL DYNAMICS:** Friendship is a central theme to all episodes. Each new encounter around the world offers a lesson in the brotherhood of humanity – creating social environments that are free of prejudice and bias.
- **ACTION AND ADVENTURE:** Location specific adventures breathe excitement into each and every episode. Whether it's a morning bush safari in Kenya or a flat-boat ride down the Me Kong Delta, each episode is full of surprises.
- **ARTS AND ENTERTAINMENT:** Learn about the creative and fine arts of an area through trips to museums, entertainment venues, markets, specialty shops, town centers, etc. The local history of art and entertainment is also explained and explored.
- **NATIONAL CUSTOMS (RELIGIOUS, CULTURAL, SOCIAL):** Visits to museums, shopping centers, religious sites, restaurants, etc. detail information on the native customs and practices in the area of interest.
- **LOCAL TRANSPORTATION:** The practical use of current modes of transport in is explored in each episode. In addition, unusual, historic, and/or native forms of transportation are highlighted – from the seat of a cyclo in Hanoi to the back of a camel in Nairobi.
- **TRIVIA:** Little known facts and trivia about the area are included to provide a look at what makes each destination unique.

SAMPLE TEACHING GUIDE OBJECTIVES

INTRODUCTION:

In this exciting new series, Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World, award winning teen hostess Elizabeth Stanton and her famous friends tour the countries of the world. Their purpose is two-fold: to both embark on a volunteer mission which aims to provide a helping hand to children-in-need and to experience the action and adventure that awaits them in each new and exotic destination.

GOAL:

This teaching guide provides a framework designed to educate audiences via activities and lessons generated from the subject matter in the program Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World. The ultimate aim is to help a young audience gain a better understanding of the world around them through the exploration of volunteerism, friendship, social dynamics, culture, geography, and adventure in a given destination.

RATIONALE:

With the rapid increase of television viewing in children and teens, there is an ever-growing need for exceptional core programming that is not only educational and informative, but engaging, thought-provoking, and entertaining. As a new series created especially for teens 13-16 and shot on location around the world, Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World provides exceptional and diverse programming designed specifically to fit the criteria of E/I programming.

SUBJECT MATTER:

The sample activities detailed in this teaching guide are specific to three destinations featured in Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World series: Nairobi, Kenya; Ho Chi Minh and Hanoi, Vietnam; and New York City, New York.

Given the wide range of subject matter and geographical destinations available, Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World can be used as an educational tool in all classrooms and educational departments. The subject matter in each episode includes elements of history, geography, social studies, grammar and composition, vocabulary, literature and government.

AUDIENCE:

The subject matter in Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World offers interesting and thought-provoking information that can be used to generate various educational lessons and activities for young audiences ranging from interactive group activities to crossword puzzles. Lesson plans and activities can be adapted to target multiple grade levels in various geographic locations and designed to meet the established state standards of education across the nation. In addition, lessons and activities can also be catered to challenge students of ALL types, including, but not limited to, ESL, gifted, average, and students with high or special needs.

In this teaching guide, an 8th grade mixed level class in the public school systems of Los Angeles, CA is the target audience.

PREREQUISITES:

This teaching guide requires the audience to view the chosen Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World DVDs in their entirety. Episodes are in English with no subtitle option.

LESSON PLAN 1

Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World: AFRICA

Where you create your own mini travel show!

Title of travel show: Nairobi, Kenya

Age Group: 13-16

Subjects:

Social dynamics
Global issues
History
Politics
Fine Arts
Geography
Grammar and Composition
Creativity
Online Research Skills

Duration: 3 class periods (2 hours in class planning; 1 ½ hours to perform)

Description:

In small groups, students will create and plan their own mini-travel show to perform live in front of the class. Travel shows should aim to add an element of volunteerism within the program, and each program should be no more than 5 minutes long.

Goals: Students will:

1. Work with cooperation and efficiency in small groups
2. Exercise online research skills
3. Develop new vocabulary
4. Utilize skills in map reading and geography
5. Practice public speaking skills
6. Think critically about global issues
7. Be creative!

Materials:

Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World: AFRICA DVD, computers with online research capabilities, pencils, paper, a list of site-specific volunteer opportunities, and photocopied maps of Africa marked with sites and attractions, miscellaneous materials of each group's choosing that will help to color and define their program

Procedure:

A brief description of the lesson at hand will be given before students watch the DVD in order to aid in their creative planning. Students will then view the DVD in class

and should be directed to take brief notes on what they find particularly appealing or interesting.

Once the DVD has been viewed, students will break into small groups of 3-4. Roles should then be determined by the group (director, host/hostess, 2nd host, director of photography, producer, costumer etc.) Students will then compare notes and refer to the map of Africa, and ultimately choose an area and volunteer opportunity in the country to research.

Students will research their chosen area and volunteer opportunity as a group. Emphasis should be placed on the issue at hand (i.e. poverty, water shortage, physical danger, etc.) as well as the geographic, historic, political, social or cultural conditions that may have exacerbated this issue. Students will then write 'stand-ups' (host/hostess monologues delivered to camera on-site) that would hypothetically be filmed on location. Students will prepare a typed, double-spaced script that will be used to perform live for the class.

Emphasis should be placed on stand-ups that are interesting, catchy, and informative. In addition, the director and/or director of photography should determine where and how to film the host – i.e. Are they placed in front of the slum, Kibera? Are they walking toward the camera while they're speaking? Should the camera follow them as they talk? Should they have a prop or wear a costume?

Each student will individually critique the group performances and script content, noting at least one element that worked and one element that could've been improved. Students will be required to turn in a copy of their group script and their individual critiques.

Assessment: Scripts and critiques will be assessed and edited for content, clarity, creativity, and composition before being returned to the students.



LESSON PLAN 2

Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World: VIETNAM

Journal Entry



Title: Vietnam

Age Group: 13-16

Subjects:

Grammar and composition
Creative writing
History
Politics

Duration: One in class viewing of 30 minute Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World followed immediately by a writing period of 20-30 minutes

Description: Students are encouraged to write a first-hand, autobiographical journal entry after viewing the program. Students may select an individual presented in the program, or alternatively, they can create their own persona. No length required; rather, emphasis should be placed on content, creativity, and specificity.

Goals: Students will:

1. Think critically
2. Practice writing skills: grammar composition, spelling, content creation
3. Meet the challenge of seeing the world through another's eyes

Materials: Pen/pencil and paper, Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World: VIETNAM DVD

Procedure: A brief introduction/discussion will take place between teacher and students before the viewing of the DVD so that the students can begin to develop writing ideas while they watch the DVD. Students should be encouraged and challenged to put themselves in their subject's shoes – to fully realize their given situation and how they would act accordingly. After viewing the DVD, students will be given 20-30 minutes of writing time. Emphasis should be placed on creativity and content, rather than spelling and composition, so that the students feel free to write in a stream of consciousness style.

Assessment: Students will be given the opportunity to share with the class and discuss.

LESSON PLAN 3

Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World: NEW YORK CITY, NY City Planning

Title: Welcome to My Neighborhood!

Age Group: 13-16

Subjects: Geography
Creative Writing
Research Skills
Critical Thinking
Sociology
Graphic Design

Duration: 2 90 minute class periods; first period allows research and planning; second period allows time for drawing and completing project

Description: Students will choose a neighborhood in New York City, NY. They will research the geography and history of the area: including major buildings (residential and business), areas of commerce, areas with parks or other natural flora/fauna. In addition, the research should include an aspect of change necessary in that neighborhood: are the buildings in need of reconstruction? Is there gang activity? Are the schools not up to par? Is there a problem with drugs and/or violence? Students will then address these issues in a diagram reconstructing the area that will be accompanied by a one page, 12 pt. font, double spaced essay detailing the issue at hand and the subsequent ideas for addressing the issue.

Goals: Students will:

1. Think critically
2. Practice problem solving skills
3. Provide a detailed, comprehensive analysis of certain issues, be they sociological, geographic, individual, political, etc.
4. Learn how to draw buildings to scale

Materials: Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World: NY, NY DVD, pencil, rulers, poster board, computer with online research capabilities, markers

Procedure: See description. Teacher can help guide the students to areas in New York where problems persist. Students will be encouraged to work in groups, and they can supply each other with ideas. Most of the work will be completed in class so that the teacher is constantly on hand to guide the students through the process as it ultimately explores sensitive issues.

Assessment: Students will be graded according to how well their ideas address the issue at hand. Drawings of the neighborhood will be 50% of the grade, and the essay will be 40% of the grade. 10% for in class presentation and Q&A.

Dr. Patricia Peterson is a Professor of Special Education and Bilingual/Multicultural Education in the College of Education at Northern Arizona University. Her focus is on research and personnel preparation of special educators and elementary education teachers who can effectively serve culturally and linguistically diverse students with disabilities.

She received her Ph.D. in Special Education with a minor in Bilingual/Bicultural Education from the University of Florida. Her Masters Degree is from Rockford College in Rockford, Illinois in Learning Disabilities. Her Bachelors of Arts Degree is also from Rockford College with a dual major in Child Development and Spanish. She has been working in the field of bilingual special education for the past 35 years. Dr. Peterson is bilingual in Spanish and English and has worked as an English as a Second Language teacher in Madrid, Spain. In her public school teaching in the U.S., she has worked as both a bilingual teacher (Kindergarten to 5th grade), and bilingual special education teacher (Kindergarten to 8th grade) in Illinois school districts where she taught primarily Hispanic children.



Stephen W. Showalter Bio

Stephen Showalter is a Clinical Instructor in Curriculum and Instruction in the Department of Teaching and Learning at Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, Arizona. His focus is on preparation of secondary teachers for middle school and high school with an emphasis on utilization of distance education technology. Currently, he teaches graduate courses in curriculum and instructional design, evaluation and assessment of learning, professional problems of teachers, research, and student development of professional writing.

Dr. Showalter completed his Ed.D. degree in Curriculum and Instruction in 2007 at Northern Arizona University. His dissertation was titled, Student Assessment in Web-based Instruction. The purpose of this descriptive survey study was to identify and describe the methods, i.e., practices and processes of assessing student learning in Web-based courses. An online survey of an international population of web-based instructors indicated that both traditional and authentic student assessment methods are used in Web-based courses, and the majority of instructors use both methods.

Dr. Showalter's Masters of Education degree at Northern Arizona University in 1999 was in Educational Leadership with a Higher Education/Community College emphasis. Also at Northern Arizona University, in 1995 he completed his Bachelors of Science degree with a major in Biology and Teacher Education. He is certified in Arizona to teach middle grades and high school biology and earth science. He taught both biology

and earth science at Greyhills High School in Tuba City, Arizona on the Navajo reservation.

Most recently, Dr. Showalter has worked at Northern Arizona University in graduate programs both as a faculty member and as a web training instructor/web course facilitator for distance education programs in Yuma and on the Navajo reservation. He was involved in recruitment of graduate students in these programs as well as in developing technology solutions for administrators, faculty, and graduate students. In this work as well as in his secondary science teaching at Greyhills High School in Tuba City on the Navajo reservation, he has worked extensively with culturally and linguistically diverse faculty and students especially those from Native American and Mexican American populations.

Dr. Showalter has presented scholarly papers at both national and international conferences primarily in the areas of multicultural education, teacher preparation, educational technology, and pedagogy in distance education. His publications center on the use of appropriate pedagogy in Web-based courses to reach students in teacher education programs in rural, remote, and international sites.
