SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

Roseland Broadcasting of Columbus Ohio Licenses, LLC (“Roseland”) acquired WCPX-LP (the “Station”), pursuant to BALTTL-20171212ABB. The assignment was consummated on May 22, 2018. The Station was operational at the time of consummation.

On June 18, 2018, Roseland requested a silent STA because the Station had ceased broadcasting, due to technical difficulties, effective June 10, 2018. The STA was granted on June 12, 2018.

On April 14, 2019, Roseland filed an application for a construction permit to modify its license.¹

On May 24, 2019, Roseland requested an Engineering STA due to structural analysis work to confirm that the elevation of the outstanding construction permit, pursuant to LMS File No. 0000071598, could be implemented.

On June 10, 2019, Roseland notified the Commission that it had resumed broadcast operations on June 7, 2019. Resumption occurred pursuant to the Engineering STA (LMS File No. 0000073226). The Station went on the air broadcasting digitally.

On June 28, 2020, Roseland filed a request for silent STA. The request was predicated on the loss of site. The STA was granted on July 28, 2020.

On January 15, 2021, Roseland filed a Request to Extend the STA. Thereafter, Roseland was actively negotiating to move onto tower ASR 1013917, and Roseland ordered a custom antenna for that site. Ultimately, that site proved unsuitable (AM interference issues), and a cancellation fee was payable to the antenna manufacturer.

On May 25, 2021, Roseland filed an application for an Engineering STA to permit it to go back to its former original site. A Resumption of Operations was filed on June 4, 2021. The Station went back on the air on June 3, 2021.

On July 7, 2021, Roseland notified the Commission that the Station had ceased operations on June 15, 2021. The request for silent STA was predicated on loss of site.

The following should be noted:

(a) Commencing with the June 7, 2019 operation, Roseland broadcast a shopping network, Jewelry TV.

(b) The utilization of the antenna site utilized by the Station was done *gratis*. Specifically, it was done as a favor by the site manager to Roseland's chief engineer. It should be noted that Roseland's chief engineer, Brian Short, is paid on a consulting basis by Roseland. His fees are not broken out by jobs performed. Accordingly, the vast majority of what the Commission looks to in order to ascertain operation does not exist.

(c) Attached to the instant submission are the EAS logs which were kept during the periods of the Station's operation.

(d) In Roseland's October 21, 2021 response to September 15, 2021 Operational Status Inquiry, Roseland provided documentation relative to expenses incurred by Roseland in implementing digital operation. Specifically, Invoice of Integrated Tower Service, Invoice of Anywave Communications Technologies (transmitter), and Invoices of Alive Telecom (antenna).

It should be noted that Roseland has authorized the preparation of engineering to move to a permanent site ASR 1207058 and is entering into a lease. Due to LMS limitations, it is prepared to immediately file the application once the Commission allows such a filing.
