

**ALEXANDRA COMMUNICATIONS, INC.**  
**Application for License Renewal**

During the most recent license term, KTIL-FM (“Station”) has provided listeners in its community of license (Bay City, Oregon) and the surrounding areas with excellent public affairs programming aimed at diverse audiences, including news, weather, sports, emergency information and other important current events, as set forth on the Station’s quarterly issues/programs lists.

In particular, the Station broadcasts twelve local newscasts each weekday. The Station also addresses community needs live each weekday morning with “Tillamook Today,” which is a county-wide local forum, featuring local interviews and in-studio guests. In addition, every Tuesday morning, the Station airs a “Community Leadership Update Meeting,” which addresses everything from COVID-19 to legislative agendas, healthcare and economic issues, and features all of the County Commissioners, the local Sheriff, Emergency Management personnel, members of the health department and hospital, all the Mayors from the cities and towns within the Station’s coverage area, plus both State Representatives and State Senators. Another daily feature is a program called “Dairyland Variety,” which is a free public service where members of the community can buy and sell items they no longer need or want, plus announce yard sales and local fundraising events.

In 2020 and 2021, the Station also broadcast the local high school and community college graduations, where in-person ceremonies were not possible due to the pandemic. The Station has won several broadcast awards for its outstanding service and has been recognized for its programs and overall excellence in public service.

Due to simple administrative oversight, the Station’s issues/programs lists for Q4 2015, all four quarters of 2016, and Q4 2018 were not uploaded on time to the Station’s online public inspection file (“OPIF”). However, importantly, Alexandra Communications, Inc. (“ACI”), the licensee of the Station, has not received any queries or complaints from any member of the public concerning the Station’s programming or the contents of its public inspection file associated with the quarters in which the issues/programs lists were uploaded late (or, indeed, during any part of the Station’s most recent license term). As set forth herein, the reported error was simply ministerial. In addition, it should be noted that ACI has uploaded the issues/programs lists for the Station on time during every quarter, starting with Q1 2017, until the present date, with the exception of Q4 2018 (which has been uploaded to the OPIF, but not on time).

On more than five occasions over the past two years, requests for political time were not uploaded within 24 hours of the Station’s receipt of those requests. Unfortunately, the staff member charged with ensuring that the uploads took place on time believed that the requests for political time were required to be uploaded at the time that such spots were due to air on the Station. That staff member now is aware of the requirements to upload all such requests to the Station’s OPIF within 24 hours of receipt. In addition, ACI has instituted new policies to ensure that all Station staff are aware of the requirement to upload requests for political time within 24 hours of

receipt, and will endeavor to ensure that there are no future violations (no matter how minor) of the Commission's rules governing maintenance of the Station's OPIF.

In summary, ACI has been in substantial compliance with the Commission's rules, and is the standard-bearer for public service in the region. Accordingly, ACI submits that no further Commission action is warranted, and that grant of this license renewal application would serve the public interest, convenience and necessity.
