Educational Program

Friends of Portland Community Radio is devoted to the education of music and the arts. Specifically, the nonprofit is devoted to the dissemination of alternative, historical, and underground music, and exposure of art, focusing on issues critical to Oregon, providing educational public affairs programming via the conduit of a freeform radio format. The organization exists to bolster creative arts and the independent music community. We believe unwaveringly in supporting groundbreaking sounds, local musicians, experimental approaches, and underrepresented voices with an anti-sellout ethos. We believe that art over radio formatting is paramount in a pursuit to maintain artistic integrity; injecting fun and freshness back in radio is our vision.

Implementation of Program

Friends of Portland Community Radio educational program implementation is achieved via two principle facets:

Public Participation

Proposed licensee would allow members of the public to participate in the radio station to learn all aspects of broadcasting, including news gathering, engineering, DJ-ing, public affairs, promotions, etc within an instructional apprenticeship.

Programming: Programming aired would be educational in nature:

Public Affairs: Select talk shows with attention to issues important to the Oregon/Northwest and syndicated shows like Sprouts, Sierra Club Radio, Alternative Radio, Making Contact, and Big Picture Science.

Music: Music programmed not currently played on other stations centering upon rare rock'n'roll, alt folk, progressive, new wave, etc curated by a DJ who delves into the biographical aspects of the artists and historical reference which could include interviews or narratives.
