

CHANNEL DISPLACEMENTS EXHIBIT

LICENSE RENEWAL

This translator station is one of thirteen licensed to Pitkin County that was displaced by the broadcast spectrum auction (all of which are listed below). A displacement application was filed and approved and subsequent construction/transition to the new channel/frequency has been completed. A new License to Cover application has been filed for this and all other displaced translators to complete the process.

The License Management System still lists the Call Sign for this translator facility as its pre-displacement version, and the License to Cover application for this and the other displaced channels are still listed as "Pending". Therefore, this attachment is intended to affirm that: a) Pitkin County has successfully transitioned all displaced channels to their new frequency as described in the Construction Permits, b) that applications for License to Cover have been submitted for all of the displaced channels to formally finalize the displacement process, and c) Pitkin County wishes to renew these translator licenses (which are presumed to also expire on April 1, 2022) to continue operating these broadcasts on their new displacement channels/frequencies under the new Call Signs.
