

Adverse Findings

Temple University - Of The Commonwealth System of Higher Education (“Temple”) is the licensee of stations WRTX, Dover, Delaware (Facility ID No. 65181); WJAZ, Summerdale, PA (Facility ID No. 65184); WRTL, Ephrata, PA (Facility ID No. 65177); WRTY, Jackson Township, PA (Facility ID No. 65178); WRTJ, Coatesville, PA (Facility ID No. 90653); WRTQ, Ocean City, NJ (Facility ID No. 65176); and WRTI, Philadelphia, PA (Facility ID No. 65190). In the instant renewal application, Temple has certified that, with respect to the licensee and each party to the application, no adverse finding has been made, nor has an adverse final action been taken by any court or administrative body in a civil or criminal proceeding brought under the provisions of any laws related to any of the following: any felony; mass media-related antitrust or unfair competition; fraudulent statements to another governmental unit; or discrimination.

In the interest of candor, however, Temple further notes the following:

1. **2018 Jury Verdict.** In Ruth Briggs v. Temple University, et al., Case No. 2:16-cv-00248, U.S.D.C., E.D. Pa., the plaintiff alleged that Temple engaged in age discrimination and retaliation. In July 2018, the plaintiff received a jury verdict in the amount of \$850,000. The matter settled while an appeal was pending in the Third Circuit, Case No. 0:18-cv-03512. This case did not involve a university officer or trustee, nor did it involve any of Temple’s broadcast stations.

2. **2019 Investigation.** Temple resolved and settled a number of investigations by governmental agencies related to its Fox School of Business and Management having misreported data to ranking organizations. Specifically, The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General, through the Bureau of Consumer Protection (“Commonwealth”), conducted an investigation against Temple and its Fox School of Business and Management pursuant to the provisions of the Pennsylvania *Unfair Trade Practices and Consumer Protection Law*, 73 P.S. § 201-1, *et seq.*, Case ID 191201869. Temple subsequently entered into a Settlement Agreement with the United States Department of Education and an Assurance of Voluntary Compliance with Commonwealth. These matters did not involve or pertain to any of Temple’s broadcast stations.
