**In re: KNNN-LP, Redding, CA**

**Notice of License Cancellation**

Dear Licensee:

This letter is to inform you that the license of Station KNNN-LP, Redding, California (Station), licensed to Walker Broadcast Group (WBG), has expired pursuant to section 312(g) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (Act).<sup>1</sup>

On July 25, 2022, we sent you a letter stating that, based upon Commission records, it appears that the Station had been silent for over 12 months in violation of section 312(g) of the Act.<sup>2</sup> The Inquiry Letter required a response within 15 days (August 9, 2022) and included a warning that failure to reply would result in a finding that the Station had not operated for 12-consecutive months, automatic expiration of the Station's license, and both cancellation of its license and deletion of its call sign in the Commission's databases.<sup>3</sup> To date, we have received no response.<sup>4</sup>

Given the lack of response to our letter, we have concluded that the Station has been silent for 12 consecutive months and its license has expired pursuant to section 312(g) of the Act.<sup>5</sup> Therefore, the Commission's public and internal databases **HAVE BEEN MODIFIED** to indicate that the broadcast license for the referenced station is **EXPIRED**, that the Station's license is **CANCELLED** as a matter of

Section 312(g) of the Act provides in pertinent part if a broadcast station fails to transmit broadcast signals with its authorized facilities for any consecutive 12-month period, then the station license granted for the operation of that broadcast station expires at the end of that period, notwithstanding any provision, term, or condition of the license to the contrary, except that the Commission may extend or reinstate such station license to promote equity and fairness.

law, and that the Station's call sign is **DELETED**.<sup>6</sup> Furthermore, the Station's pending request for tolling **HAS BEEN DISMISSED** and its digital construction permit has been forfeited.<sup>7</sup> The Station no longer has authority to operate or construct a digital facility.
