

2022 CHILDREN'S PROGRAM REPORT: COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

1st Quarter:

KCBY supported the educational and informational needs of children through on-air news stories, local campaigns, PSAs and digital information. Topics covered in local news this quarter included: Coos Bay gym training local athletes, Bay area Chamber of Commerce awards additional local scholarships, CASA of Coos and Curry Counties need more volunteers, and South Coast Together holds trauma awareness workshops. The station aired the following PSAs targeting children's issues this quarter: Support Foster Care, Talk to your teen about Marijuana, and Kids Safety.

2nd Quarter:

KCBY supported the educational and informational needs of children through on-air news stories, local programming, local campaigns, PSAs and digital information. This quarter the station sponsored the CanDo! Food Drive in April in Coos Bay and May with money raised going to area's food banks. The station also participated in the Rotary's Art Spark Campaign supporting Arts Education in area schools. And in May, the station's Meteorologist spoke to a group of 45 first graders at Skyview Elementary about careers in Meteorology as well as broadcasting careers. He also discussed and performed various science experiments. Kid targeted issues were covered in local news this quarter on the following topics: children swimming lessons shortage, high schoolers protesting anti-gay bill, healthy kids on social media, kids cleaning up the city, youth harm prevention, books for Ukraine kids, suicide prevention, Dozer days for kids, violence and kids, 4J STEM workshops, shooter warning signs, youth and climate change, Library activity kits, and teens and drug prevention. The station also promoted the Kids Hope Center Annual Family Walk event, upgrading area school facilities, transforming North Bend school into a youth sports complex, and Coos County students receive free books to hundreds of first graders.

3rd Quarter:

KCBY supported the educational and informational needs of children through the following. This quarter the station aired news stories with the following kid-targeted topics: North Bend's Summer Youth Program, Healthy Kids Series, Kids opening Succulent Plant Business, Kids book & backpack giveaway, everyday kid Outdoors Program, Stuff the Jeep with School supplies, Prefontaine Memorial Run with a 5K high school team, Summer Community Dance for all ages, City of North Bend summer education programs needing funding, Every Child Coos County, Preparing for Climate Change, and the Front Street Community Bike Works cycling workshop for children and teens. The station also aired kid-targeted PSAs during this quarter on the following issues: Foster Care, Talk to Teens about Marijuana, and Kids Summer Safe.

4th Quarter:

KCBY supported the educational and informational needs of children through on-air campaigns, PSAs and digital information.
