

WLIW(TV) NextGeneration TV Application Exhibit

WNET, licensee of television station WLIW-TV, Garden City, New York (Fac ID 38336) is filing the instant application to request authority to commence ATSC 3.0 operations on WLIW. As explained below, this proposal complies with Section 73.3801(f)(5) of the rules and is therefore eligible for expedited processing. WLIW will not be making any changes to its technical parameters other than the change to the ATSC 3.0 standard; therefore, this proposal is eligible for streamlined processing pursuant to section 73.3801(f)(3) of the rules.

As noted in the application, the primary WLIW program stream will be simulcast in ATSC 1.0 on Station WNET, Newark, New Jersey, which is also licensed to WNET. In accordance with FCC policy, because WLIW and WNET are commonly owned, they have not entered into a simulcast agreement. The map prepared by Chesapeake RF Consultants, LLC attached as Exhibit 1 demonstrates that 100 % of the population within WLIW's noise limited service contour will receive WLIW's ATSC 1.0 signal from Station WNET. Therefore, the 95% coverage requirement set forth in Section 73.3801(f)(5) is satisfied. The attached map also demonstrates that the principal community contour of Station WNET will cover the entire community of Garden City, New York, WLIW's community of license, in compliance with Section 73.3801(c) of the rules. Stations WLIW and WNET are both in the New York City DMA.

WLIW also broadcasts three secondary multicast streams in ATSC 1.0—*World*, *All Arts* and *Create*. The World and All Arts streams will be broadcast in ATSC 1.0 on Station WNET, which, as noted above, is also owned by WNET. WNET has entered into an agreement with CBS Broadcasting Inc., the licensee of Station WCBS-TV, New York, NY, to broadcast Create in ATSC 1.0 on WCBS-TV. The map attached as Attachment 2 shows that 100% of the population within WLIW's noise limited service contour is within the WCBS-TV noise limited service contour. WNET is filing a separate legal STA request for the multicast streams which clarifies that WNET will have full responsibility for compliance with Commission rules for the multicast stream broadcast on WCBS-TV. WLIW will be airing the same programming in ATSC 1.0 on WNET and WCBS-TV as it is currently airing in the same resolutions and therefore will not be using more capacity on the ATSC 1.0 host stations than it is currently using on its ATSC 1.0 facilities. The PSIP virtual channels for each of WLIW's program streams described in this exhibit will not change.

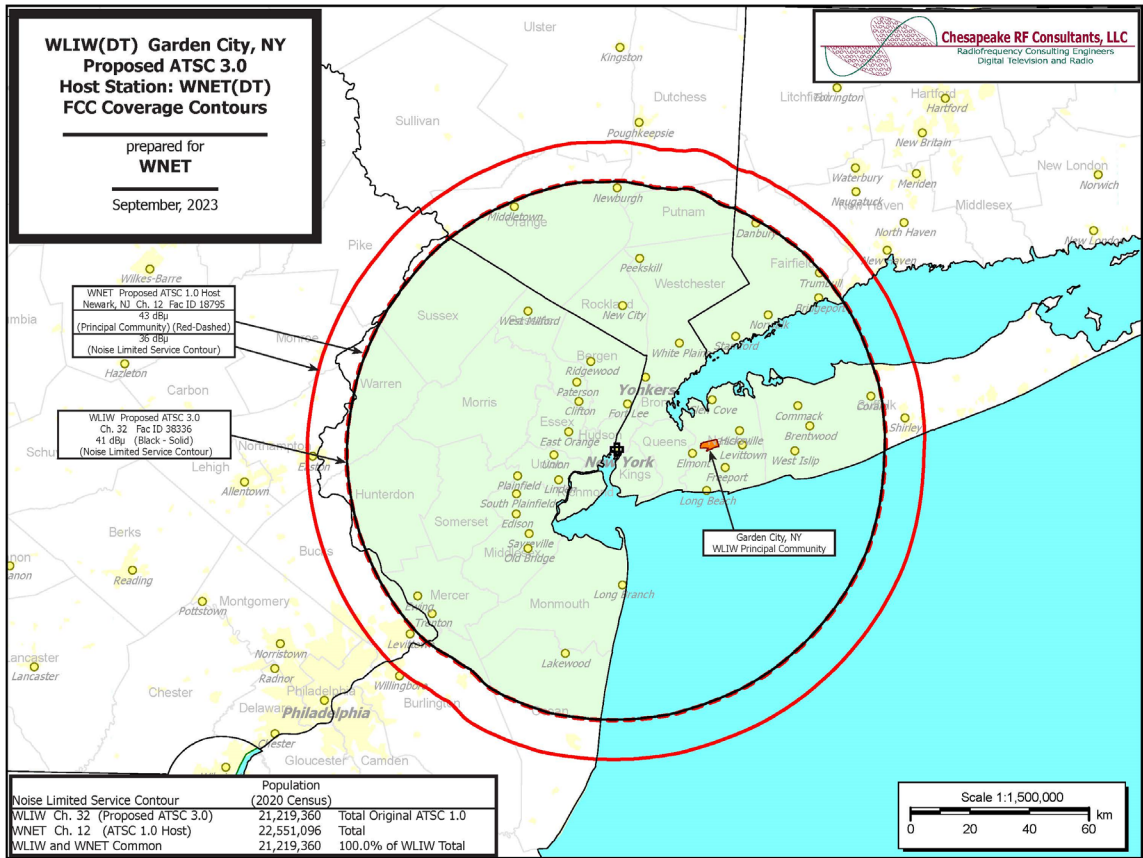
