

Sankofa African Network (SAN) was incorporated as a non-profit educational organization on February 12, 2020 at 17300 River Ridge Blvd in Woodbridge, Virginia phone number 703-944-5568 which will serve as the proposed public accessible studio site, producing local origination programming for the contemplated low power FM facility.

SAN's purpose is to integrate and support African immigrants and refugees as they strive to build new lives. Our mission emphasizes the teaching of the importance of diversity and inclusion. We accomplish this by providing social integration services, legal residence assistance information, youth tutoring and counseling services, and broadcast media services to the underserved populations.

We pledge to operate the proposed low powered FM broadcast facility pursuant to part 73 sub part G of the commission's rules.

We have demonstrated our eligibility for authorization based on our incorporation in the state of Virginia as a nonprofit entity, which proposes programming content to advance educational objectives. Applicant intends to honor the commitment set forth in its form 318 application including those with respect to the local origination of programming. Radio programming will take the form of talk shows and commentaries and music.

Our radio station will serve as an educational hub on and off the air. We will collaborate with Northern Virginia Community College (NOVA) and local high schools to provide training, internships, and unique volunteer experience for students of all ages. Our local radio shows will cover local news and history, public safety, wellness, personal finance, life and job skills and coverage of community festivals and activities.

Cultural enrichment and digital engagement will be the cornerstones of the educational programming. The key to all of our activities is the goal to use media to allow community members to participate in the public sphere and to make strides to close the digital divide and foster a collaborative social connection in the community. We plan to run the LPFM station at least a minimum of 12 hours a day, utilizing a minimum of 8 hours a day for local programs. However, we will not air commercials but will be focused on achieving our educational goals.

We believe that an LPFM station will be a valuable change agent to complement the work we do. Thank you for your consideration of our application.
