FCC Violations During Renewal Term

Scripps Broadcasting Holdings LLC (“Scripps”) is the licensee of KSBY(TV), San Luis Obispo, California (the “Station”). On May 1, 2019, Cordillera Communications, LLC (“Cordillera”) transferred control of the licensee of the Station to Scripps Media, Inc. pursuant to the Commission’s approval of a long form transfer of control application (BTCCDT-20181109AAY). Scripps Media, Inc. immediately thereafter assigned the Station’s license to Scripps pursuant to the Commission’s approval of a *pro forma* assignment of license (BALCDT-20181113ACB).

While Scripps is not responsible for violations that occurred under the prior licensee, Scripps notes that in 2015, the FCC issued a *Notice of Apparent Liability for Forfeiture* (DA 15-71, released January 22, 2015) against the former licensee of KSBY(TV), KSBY Communications, LLC, for violations of Section 73.3526(e)(11)(iii) for failure to timely file children’s programming reports for eight quarters during the previous renewal term of 2006-2014.

In addition, before the sale occurred in 2019, the Commission began an investigation into Cordillera’s compliance with the Commission’s tower rules. Following the consummation of Scripps’ acquisition of the Station, Scripps and the Enforcement Bureau entered into a Consent Decree to resolve the investigation into Cordillera’s acts and omissions. *See* DA 20-24, rel. January 13, 2020. Since the violations described in the Consent Decree are not attributable to Scripps, those violations are not relevant to the FCC’s consideration of the instant application.
