Operational Status Inquiry

Dear Licensee:

It has come to our attention that AM Station WMOB, Mobile, Alabama (Station), licensed to UM Enterprise, LLC (Licensee), may have been silent or operating with unauthorized facilities for more than a year. However, Commission records show that the Station is licensed and operating. Pursuant to section 73.1015 of the Commission's rules (Rules), Licensee is required to clarify this matter in writing within forty-five (45) days of the date of this letter.

Background. Our records show that Licensee requested Special Temporary Authority (STA) to operate the Station with an emergency antenna on August 2, 2022, and that we granted that request on August 8, 2022.¹ Extensions of STA were filed on January 30, 2023, September 19, 2023, and March 13, 2024.² In December 2023, Commission staff in the area noted that there was no detectable signal coming from the Station, and in March 2024, staff again noted no signal and that there was no facility at the STA site. In addition, a webpage also notes that the Station did not appear to be operating from its licensed or STA sites between March and December 2023.³

Based on this information, it appears that the Station may have been silent (or failed to operate with authorized facilities) for more than one year. Pursuant to section 312(g) of the Act, **if a broadcast station fails to transmit broadcast signals with its authorized facilities for any consecutive 12-month period, then the station license granted for the operation of that broadcast station expires at the end of that period, notwithstanding any provision, term, or condition of the license to the contrary, except that the Commission may extend or reinstate such station license to promote equity and fairness.**

This letter provides Licensee **45 days** to submit evidence of the Station's operation with authorized facilities from August 2, 2022, through the present date. If Licensee fails to provide such documented evidence within **45 days** from the date of this letter, the Commission's public and internal databases WILL BE MODIFIED to indicate that the broadcast license for the Station is EXPIRED, that

the Station's license is CANCELED as a matter of law, and that the Station's call sign is DELETED.

Information and Materials Requested.

Operational Status. The materials required to establish the operational status of the Station are as follows. **Failure to respond appropriately to this letter constitutes a violation of the Act and Rules.**

First, Licensee must provide a narrative statement that indicates the Station's operational status from August 2, 2022 to the present, including during and after dismantling of the Station's facilities. Licensee must indicate the dates on which the Station was silent, operated with its licensed facilities, or operated with technical parameters other than those specified by its license. For all dates, Licensee must indicate the effective radiated power, antenna height above ground level and geographic coordinates and address. Licensee must also indicate any dates on which the Station operated at a variance from its licensed parameters, including specification of the unauthorized location and the technical parameters used.

In addition to the narrative statement, Licensee must submit documentation from August 2, 2022 to the present, of:

1. The Station's operational status, including periods of silence or unauthorized operation.
2. The Station's location, effective radiated power and antenna height above ground level.
3. The Station's leases, personnel records (including payroll records appropriately redacted to protect the privacy of individual employees), engineering records, and station logs, including EAS logs.
4. Copies of all invoices, bills, including utility bills, checks written or received, credit card charges, wire transfers or deposits of funds relating to the Station's operation.
5. Photographs of the Station's studio facilities and transmission facilities during this timeframe, including the dates applicable to each photograph taken, and exact Station coordinates.

Affidavits or Declarations. In addition to the documentation noted above, Licensee must support its response with an affidavit or declaration under penalty of perjury, signed and dated by an authorized representative of Licensee, with personal knowledge of the representations provided in the response, verifying the truth and accuracy of the information therein and that all of the information requested by this letter which is in Licensee possession, custody, control or knowledge has been produced. If multiple persons contribute to the response, in addition to such general affidavit or declaration of the authorized representative of Licensee noted above, any such person (or any other affiant or declarant) that is relying on the personal knowledge of any other individual, rather than his or her own knowledge, must provide separate affidavits or declarations of each such individual with personal knowledge that identify clearly to which responses the affiant or declarant with such personal knowledge is attesting. All such declarations provided must comply with section 1.16 of the Rules, and be substantially in the form set forth therein. We remind Licensee that to knowingly and willfully make any false statement or conceal any material fact in reply to this inquiry is punishable by fine or imprisonment. Moreover, failure to respond appropriately to this letter of inquiry may constitute a violation of the Act and the Rules.

We also note that it is imperative to the safety of air navigation that any prescribed painting and

illumination of the Station's tower shall be maintained.⁴
