# RESPONSE TO NOTICE OF APPARENT LIABILITY FOR FORFEITURE

Pacific Telestations, LLC (the "Licensee" or "Pacific"), by its counsel, hereby responds to the above-captioned Notice of Apparent Liability for Forfeiture (the "NAL"), released December 23, 2015, and for its response, states as follows:

The NAL proposes the assessment of a \$16,000 forfeiture for:

- failure to file the KUAM-TV Children's Television Programming Reports in a timely manner for five quarters;
- failure to file the KUAM-TV quarterly TV issues/programs lists for fifteen quarters; and
- failure to report violations in the KUAM-TV license renewal application.

For the following reasons, Pacific requests that the Commission eliminate the proposed forfeiture.

#### **Children's Television Programming Reports**

The Notice claims that five Reports were filed late: 2012 Quarters 3 and 4, 2014

Quarter 3, and 2014 Quarters 1 and 2.2 This is inaccurate.

The Reports for 2014 Quarters 1 and 2 were timely filed. See the Submission

Confirmations, attached as Exhibits 1 and 2, bearing filing dates of April 10, 2014, and July 9,

2014, respectively. After the timely filing of these reports, the Licensee discovered that the response to one question had been inadvertently changed and was wrong. Pacific filed amendments to the reports on September 21, 2014 (Quarter 1 of 2014), and August 4, 2014 (Quarter 2 of 2014). See Exhibits 3 and 4. The amended reports state at Item 17:

This amended report is filed in order to change the response to Item 9.a. from "No" to "Yes." KUAM-TV has always provided information identifying each Core Program aired on its station, including an indication of the target child audience, to publishers of program guides as required by 47 C.F.R Section 73.673.

The Report for <u>2014 Quarter 3</u> was timely filed. See the Submission Confirmation, attached as Exhibit 5, bearing a filing date of October 10, 2014.

The Reports for <u>2012 Quarters 3 and 4</u> would have been timely filed, but technical issues with the Commission's server caused problems and delayed the filings by three business days.<sup>3</sup>

With the 3d Quarter report, counsel brought the problems with the filing system to the attention of the Commission staff in an email on October 5, 2012. Commission staff member Ron Graser responded four days later, on October 9, 2012, by forwarding a copy of the Commission's July 2, 2012, Public Notice (DA 12-1029) titled "Technical Support for Filing

Children's Television Programming Reports (FCC Form 398)." <sup>4</sup> See Exhibit 6, a copy of the email thread and enclosure.

On October 10, 2012, counsel, assisting Pacific in the filing, advised:

I sent the file to the FCC staff this afternoon, after attempting to upload it in their e-support system did not work, and after I faxed it to them . . . . [T]he staff told me many others were having similar problems. I asked them to give us an extension of time to file, which they will do.

On Saturday, October 13, 2012, counsel advised that "The FCC staff sent me a fixed file, which I was able to open and review. The information looks good. . . . I shall file the report on my Monday, Oct 15." The report was thus filed at the earliest possible time after the Commission staff assisted in resolving the problem with the filing system, albeit three business days after the deadline.

An explanation for the lateness of the report was added at Item 17 of Form 398:

This report was unable to be filed by October 10, 2012, due to technical issues with the local saved data and the Commission's server. The Commission staff assisted in resolving the issues and indicated an extension of time to file the report would be granted.

With the 4th Quarter report, technical issues with the Commission's server corrupted the data and the report was unable to be filed on time. On January 8, 2013, counsel sent a tech support inquiry to the FCC staff, ULS Help Case HD0000001986427. On January 14, 2013, counsel reported to Pacific, "the staff has advised that they initiated a notation of an extension of time to file the report, as they did for 3Q." The technical support staff responded by email, advising:

Response from developer:

As in Q3 2012 , I had to modify the .htm file to change the action so that it would point to FCC production server and not to the user's hard disk.

I have attached the corrected file as saved kuan q4 2012.

To avoid these errors in future, we highly recommend that the user should use the new version of the program which can be access using this link http://licensing.fcc.gov/KidVidNew/public/Please use the new version from next quarter onwards.

After reviewing the corrected file, counsel filed the report on January 15, 2013, which was three business days late, but as soon as possible after the Commission staff assisted with resolving the problem with the filing system.

An explanation for the lateness of the report was added at Item 17 of Form 398:

This report was unable to be filed by January 10, 2013, due to technical issues with the local saved data and the Commission's server. The Commission staff assisted in resolving the issues and indicated an extension of time to file the report would be granted.

KUAM-TV has always taken very seriously its reporting obligations for children's television programming. On two occasions, the station missed the deadline by only three business days. The reports were late for reasons clearly beyond the Licensee's control. The late-filings occurred in two consecutive quarters, during a sustained period when the station (and apparently many others) had technical issues with the Commission's server. KUAM-TV asked for permission to file late, and was given assurances by the FCC staff on both occasions that the informal requests for an extension of time to file the reports would be granted.

Under the circumstances, the proposed forfeiture of \$3,000 for failure to file the KUAM-TV Children's Television Programming Reports in a timely manner for five quarters should be eliminated.

#### **Quarterly Television Issues-Programs Lists**

The Notice claims that the station's failure to timely place hard copies of its quarterly television issues/programs lists in the KUAM-TV physical public file for fifteen quarters prior to August 2, 2012 (the date the Commission's electronic public inspection file became effective) constitutes an apparent willful and/or repeated violation of Section 73.3526(e)(11)(i) of the Rules.<sup>5</sup> This is not so.

Pacific Telestations, LLC, acquired the KUAM-TV license on February 12, 2013. It is not responsible for the condition of the public inspection file prior to that time, or for any act of omission or commission by the prior licensee.

The failures of which the NAL takes notice were neither willful nor repeated failures of the current licensee. Section 312(f)(1) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, defines "willful" as "the conscious and deliberate commission or omission of [an] act, irrespective of any intent to violate any provision of this chapter or any rule or regulation of the Commission". Pacific Telestations, LLC, cannot be charged with the conscious and deliberate commission or omission of an act by another corporate entity. And if Pacific Telestations, LLC, did not commit or omit an act, it obviously cannot be said to have acted repeatedly, as defined by Section 312(f)(2) of the Act.

The Commission has explained that "willful" means "the violator *knew* it was taking or failing to take the action in question, irrespective of any intent to violate the Commission's rules." *Saga Communications of New England, LLC*, 25 FCC Rcd 3289, 3292 (Enf. Bur. 2010) (Emphasis added). Here, the Licensee was not the violator; it did not take or fail to take the action in question; it had no knowledge.

The NAL relies upon Commission precedent that a transfer of control of a licensee's stock subsequent to a violation does not excuse the licensee for the violation.<sup>7</sup> But that is not the whole story, and that is not the case here.

Station ownership changed in February 2013, after the Commission approved not only a long-form transfer of control application in BTCCDT-20121121AAL, but also follow-on pro forma license assignment application to the current licensee, in BALCDT-20130131AAX. The change in beneficial ownership of the Licensee occurred with the new assignee entity, not with a transfer of interests in the former licensee entity. The consummation notice was filed pursuant only to the application for assignment of license. Thus in this case, the filing of a long form transfer of control and the filing of a short-form assignment of license, taken together, comprise an effective long form assignment of license.<sup>8</sup>

Accordingly, the proposed forfeiture of \$10,000 for failure to timely place hard copies of the KUAM-TV quarterly television issues/programs lists in the station's physical public file for fifteen quarters prior to August 2, 2012, should be eliminated.

Communications, LLC,* 20 FCC Rcd 16557 (Media Bur. 2005), the Commission contends that a short form assignment subsequent to a long form transfer of control does not relieve liability for violations during the license term. NAL at 4. But that case is inapposite. There, a new shareholder acquired the stock of the licensee and continued to operate the station under his ownership. Not until nearly a year later did he file a short form license assignment application. Here, the long form transfer of control was not consummated, but instead, the new ownership acquired the license into a new entity.

#### **License Renewal Reporting**

The Notice claims that the Licensee's failure to report in its license renewal application that five Children's Television Programming Reports were untimely filed, constitutes an apparent violation of Section 73.3514(a) of the Rules.9

As shown above, three of the five allegedly late reports were in fact timely filed, for Quarters 1 and 2 of 2014 and for Quarter 3 of 2014. The remaining two reports, Quarters 3 and 4 of 2012, would have been timely filed, but technical issues with the Commission's server caused problems and delayed the filings. KUAM-TV informally requested an extension of time to file the reports and received the assurances of the Commission staff that extensions would be granted. The station relied upon such assurances to excuse the three-day late filings.

Regardless of the lateness of the filings, they were effected by the prior licensee, Pacific Telestations, Inc. Its successor, Pacific Telestations, LLC, cannot certify its predecessor's compliance with the Commission's rules, and its certification may not be faulted as a result.<sup>10</sup>

Accordingly, the proposed forfeiture of \$3,000 for failure to report in the KUAM-TV license renewal application that five Children's Television Programming Reports were untimely filed, should be eliminated.

The Commission has recognized that in the context of a license renewal application, "a transferee cannot, as a legal or practical matter, certify that the licensee complied with the Commission's rules during a period of time prior to the transferee obtaining ownership." Mapleton License of San Luis Obispo, LLC, 27 FCC Rcd 4099, 4101 n. 19 (Enf. Bur. 2012), citing Hensley Broadcasting, Inc., 24 FCC Rcd 115, 116 n.9 (Enf. Bur. 2009).

#### Conclusion

The proposed forfeitures are unwarranted and should be eliminated altogether. The allegedly late-filed Children's Television Programming Reports were either timely filed, or were excusably tardy. Pacific is not responsible for failures in the filing of quarterly television issuesprograms lists by the prior licensee. The Licensee did not falsely certify compliance with the Commission's rules in the KUAM-TV license renewal application.

I'm having issues with the attached file. When I load it into Firefox and select Update Local, I get this error message:

Firefox can't find the file at /C:/Users/John/Documents/Client Files/Pacific Telestations, Inc/KidVid/kuam 3q12\_files/kuam 3q12\_files/kuam 3q12\_htm.

Check the file name for capitalization or other typing errors. Check to see if the file was moved, renamed or deleted.

I originally had copied the .htm file into the subfolder KidVid and when I opened in Firefox and attempted Update Local, the error message referred to the location "KidVid/kuam 3q12\_files", which was nonexistent. I then created the subfolder "kuam 3q12\_files" and placed a copy of the .htm file in there. Then the above error message appeared, when I attempted Update Local again.

The required quarterly filing of the Children's Television Programming Reports (FCC Form 398) by commercial television station licensees may be filed electronically via the <u>Children's Educational</u> <u>Television Reporting – Form 398 information page</u> commencing today, July 2. The form must be filed by July 10<sup>th</sup>, 2012.

To support stations' timely and accurate filing, the Commission has included KidVid Support within the <u>Children's Educational Television Reporting – Form 398 information page</u> to provide troubleshooting guidance and FAQs.

If stations require further assistance, support is available via Internet and phone.

Via the Internet, contact FCC eSupport at <a href="http://esupport.fcc.gov/request.htm">http://esupport.fcc.gov/request.htm</a>. Filers must select "Children's Television Reporting System (CDBS – KidVid)" from the "FCC System" dropdown menu.

Via phone, contact FCC eSupport Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. ET (except Federal holidays), at 1-877-480-3201 (TTY: 1-717-338-2824) and select Option 2.
