Dear Licensee:

This is with respect to the Petition for Reinstatement (Petition) filed April 25, 2017, by Northwest Christian Broadcasting (Licensee), the licensee of Station KJYY-LD, Portland, Oregon (Station), seeking reinstatement of the Station's license. For the reasons below we grant the Petition and reinstate the Station's license and call-sign.

On February 16, 2017, the Video Division cancelled the Station's license and deleted its call sign for failing to transmit a broadcast signal for a consecutive 12-month period, as required by Section 312(g) of the Communications Act of 1934.¹ Based on the facts and circumstances stated in the Petition, we find that reinstatement of the license is appropriate and would be in furtherance of the public interest. We note that the public interest benefits in support of reinstatement do not excuse the Licensee's ignorance of our rules and its failure to inform the Commission of the Station's resumption of operations. While we decline to take any further action against the Licensee at this time, we remind the Licensee of its obligation to comply and become familiar with all relevant statutes and Commission rules.² We do not rule out sanctions in the future for violations of a similar nature.

Accordingly, the Petition for Reconsideration filed by Northwest Christian Broadcasting **IS GRANTED** and the license, File No BLDLTL-20110705ABF, and call sign for Station KJYY-LD, Portland, Oregon, **ARE REINSTATED**.
