Dear Licensees,

On March 23, 2020, WLS Television, Inc., licensee of Station WLS-TV, Chicago, Illinois (WLS); NBC Telemundo License, LLC, licensee of Station WMAQ-TV, Chicago, Illinois (WMAQ); and Fox Television Stations, LLC, licensee of Station WFLD, Chicago, Illinois (WFLD) (collectively Licensees and Stations) filed the above-referenced requests for waiver of the Commission's tolling provisions and tolling of the Stations' construction permit expiration dates. For the reasons below, we grant Chicago Licensee's requests and toll the expiration date of the Stations' construction permits 180 days through October 13, 2020.<sup>1</sup>

*Background.* Pursuant to Section 73.3700(b)(5) of the Commission's rules (Rules), a station that was assigned a new channel as a result of the Commission's incentive auction and repacking process may request a single extension of its construction permit deadline of up to 180 days to complete construction of its post-auction facility.<sup>2</sup> All subsequent requests for additional time to construct are subject to the Commission's tolling provisions of Section 73.3598(b) of the Rules.<sup>3</sup> The Commission's tolling provisions provide that a construction permit deadline may be tolled under specific circumstances such as

acts of God, delays due to administrative or judicial review, or construction that is delayed by any cause of action pending before a court of competent jurisdiction relating to any necessary local, state, or federal requirement for the construction or operation of the station, including any zoning or environmental requirement.<sup>4</sup> If a station does not qualify for tolling under these criteria, good cause may exist to waive the Commission's tolling provisions and tolling may still be warranted where the licensee can demonstrate that "rare and exceptional circumstances" prevented construction by the station's construction permit expiration date.<sup>5</sup>

Chicago Licensees request waivers of the tolling rule and tolling of the Stations' construction permits for their post-incentive auction channel facilities through October 13, 2020. The Stations are currently operating on their post-auction channels with interim facilities.<sup>6</sup> The Stations were each granted construction permit extensions and their permits currently expire April 15, 2020.<sup>7</sup>

In largely identical requests for tolling waivers, Chicago Licensees note that the Stations broadcast from Willis Tower, which hosts a shared, multi-tenant communications facility that supports a variety of broadcast stations, including full power television stations, Class A television stations and several FM radio stations. All of the work required to implement the repack, including the fabrication and installation of the Stations' post-auction main antennas, must be coordinated through Willis Tower and their engineering/construction firm. While significant progress has been made to complete the Stations' permanent post-auction channel facilities, delays relating to finalizing the facilities structural specifications, fabrication of the post-auction antenna, local permitting, and scheduling a helicopter for the final installation of the antennas has prevented the Stations from being able to complete construction by their current April 15, 2020 construction permit expiration dates. Therefore, Chicago Licensees seek waivers of the tolling rules and tolling of the Stations' construction permit deadlines to October 13, 2020.

*Discussion.* Upon review of the facts and circumstances presented, we find that sufficient circumstances exist to waive Section 73.3598(b) of the Rules and to toll the expiration date of the Stations' construction permits to October 13, 2020. We find that Chicago Licensees were unable to complete construction of their post-auction channel facilities due to a variety of construction related delays. We also find that grant of Chicago Licensees' waivers and tolling requests is not likely to negatively impact the overall transition schedule and will not cause interference to other stations. The Stations have already ceased operation on their pre-auction channels and initiated temporary operations on their post-auction channels. To the extent some viewers are unable to receive the Stations' signals while they operate using interim facilities, we believe that Chicago Licensees have every incentive to

ensure viewers are fully informed about the Stations' transition plans. Ultimately, we conclude that the public interest will be served by grant of waiver and tolling of the Stations' construction permits.

We remind Chicago Licensees that pursuant to the Spectrum Act, the Station is eligible for reimbursement from the TV Broadcast Relocation Fund (Fund) of costs "reasonably incurred . . . in order for the licensee to relocate its television service from one channel to the other."<sup>8</sup> Additional expenses incurred, such as expenses resulting from changes in a Stations' transition plans that are not related to the post-incentive auction channel change, may not be reimbursable from the Fund.

The above facts considered, WLS Television, Inc., NBC Telemundo License, LLC, and Fox Television Stations, LLC's requests for waiver of the Commission's tolling provisions **ARE GRANTED**. The construction permits (LMS File Nos. 0000034300, 0000072366 and 0000080396) for WLS-TV, Chicago, Illinois, WMAQ-TV, Chicago, Illinois, and WFLD, Chicago, Illinois, **ARE TOLLED to October 13, 2020**. Grant of these tolling waivers does not permit the Stations to recommence operation on their pre-auction channels. We also remind Chicago Licensees that any subsequent requests for tolling of its construction permit deadline will be subject to the Commission's tolling provisions.<sup>9</sup>
