Core Programming Processing Guidelines Certification

Station can confirm that it aired at least 3 hours per week on each of its main and multicast streams and uploaded all children's television programming reports on a timely basis under its current ownership between the first quarter of 2017 and the inaugural annual children's programming report covering September 16 through December 31, 2019. In the course of preparing its Form 303-S license renewal, Station discovered in a close review of its public file that, with respect to one core program on its main stream, it scheduled make-goods for more than half of its first-home air dates in some quarters. Therefore, while each preemption was made-good in a dedicated second home and was subject to the required prior promotion, in an abundance of caution and based on prior informal FCC staff guidance, Station is disclosing the fact that one of its programs was preempted for a majority of the weeks in some quarters.

Following the discovery of this issue, the Station will undertake closer review of its children's television programming in advance of each quarter to confirm that its E/I-eligible programming meets all current FCC requirements and informal Staff guidance.
